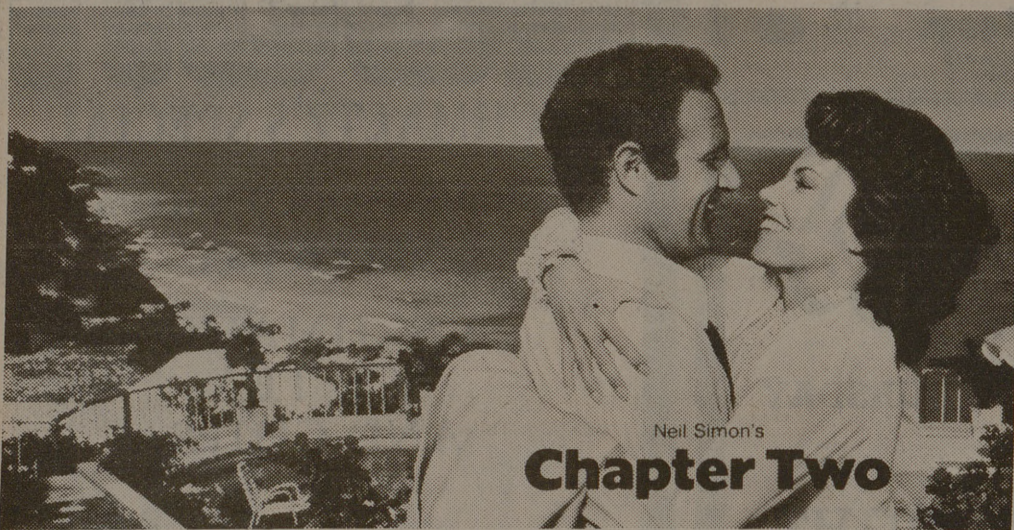

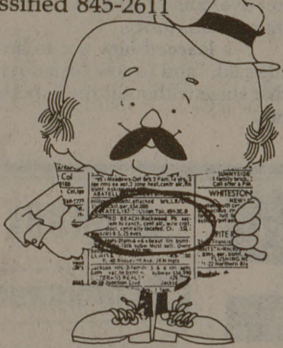

The College Station City Council will meet today at 7 p.m. in the College Station City Hall.

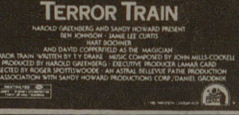
An ordinance granting an annexation request and zoning of 55 acres southeast of Texas Avenue and Pinion Drive is on the agenda.

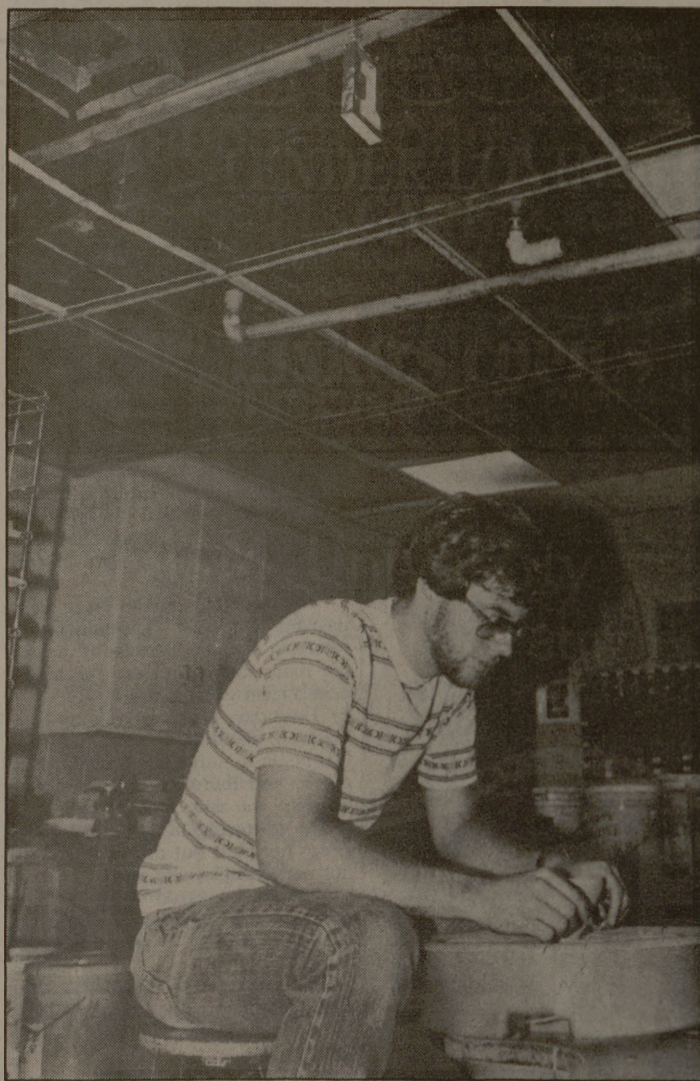

Craft shop fixes leak

MSC Craft Shop is free from the water damage that has plagued its ceiling since it began operating.

The water came from a ceiling drip pan in the dish washing area of the MSC cafeteria, located directly above the shop.

And craft shop director Grauke considers the dripping water, which has ruined most of the ceiling panels in the shop, a hazardous situation.

"Our floors are glazed and they are as slick as ice when they get wet," she said. "There have been times when dishes have fallen through the ceiling."

Grauke also said that the corroded electrical box in the ceiling, damaged by the water, she said she feels is a fire hazard. MSC Director Jim Reynolds said the University has spent over \$100,000 trying to find a permanent solution to the problem he said is caused by a faulty design.

Seeing no permanent solution in the near future, the shop has taken matters into their own hands.

They have purchased and installed large sheet-metal drip pans in the ceiling. The pans will catch the dripping from above and direct it through a series of hoses leading to a drain.

"We know it's not a permanent solution, but at least we can keep the floor dry and prevent some accidents," Grauke said.

The University has provided ceiling tiles to replace those damaged by the dripping water.

"With the drip pans and the ceiling tiles in place, we have a much more comfortable place to work," said Grauke. "We are very fortunate that we got the problem worked out before our craft classes started this semester."

Grauke said the craft shop has spent about \$60 to \$70, and a lot of man-hours to find a solution to the problem.

Several projects belonging to students, including an Ash spinning wheel, a cedar hope chest and a butcherblock table top, were damaged as a result of the dripping water. Grauke said that she has a list of damages to her, and she hopes the students will be able to receive restitution for their projects.
