Baylor brings 'miracle team' to face Ags Saturday at Kyle Field

Before the season began, there was a feeling in the Heart of Texas that Baylor football fortunes might very well surpass the miracle season of 1974 when the Bears won their first Southwest Conference crown in five decades.

Now, at the midpoint of the season, not only are Baylor partisans convinced of the Bears' potential, so are foes and observers around the rest of the conference.

Texas A&M Head Coach Tom Wilson has called the Bears the best Baylor team he's seen in the 17 years he's participated in the conference as a player and coach.

Baylor is currently 5-0 on the year and already has piled up a 3-0 record in league play. It's the first 5-0 mark for the Bears in 20 years. Baylor showed how good it really is by coming back from a 21-0 deficit in the second quarter last weekend to triumph over previously unbeaten SMU, 32-28.

It's become apparent that Head Coach Grant Teaff has solved the major problem left over from last year's 8-4 season. Even more encouraging is the fact no new problems have surfaced.

The problem referred to was a distinct lack of talent at the quarterback position. Last year, the Bears had a paltry, if not horrid, pass completion rate of 34 percent. Amazingly, Baylor went on to its first bowl victory in 16 seasons and finished with a ranking of 14th in the nation. Teaff still shakes his head at the thought of it all. "That has to be some sort of record. I sure don't believe it's happened too often."

Now, however, he has a wealth of talent in quarterbacks Jay Jeffrey, David Mangrum and Mike Brannon. For a while, Teaff had the pleasant dilemma as to who to make the starter.

Brannon had already shown what he could do, having guided the Bears to the Peach Bowl where he was chosen the offensive MVP. Yet, it was also at the Peach Bowl that Brannon wrecked his knee and had to undergo surgery, thus wiping out all his spring work.

Jeffrey was a better, faster runner while Mangrum had a shotgun passing arm which has often evoked comparisons to Pittsburgh Steeler leader Terry Bradshaw.

But it is Jeffrey who has come to the fore. Against SMU, he showed why he won the starter's job by guiding the Bears to four touchdowns and a field goal after the 21-0 deficit. Jeffrey himself scored three of the TDs on runs of three, two and six yards. Teaff was ecstatic about Jeffrey's handling of his team's comeback.

"I wasn't all that surprised by the 14-point lead," said Teaff, referring to the early scoring blitz. "Their coverage and their interception to make it 21-0 have been a good time to respond by helping us." Jeffrey has also become a conference leader in the He's averaging 178.8 yards per game, good for second in the league-leading Donnie Federal of Texas.

Jeffrey has one of the best leading receivers in the LULAC senior Robert Holt. Holt is the league with 20 receptions for an average of four yards per game. His receptions plus 15.6 yards apiece and he's the Bears' leading receiver. By comparison, Mike White catches for 3.4 yards per game. He is also averaging 18 yards per catch with two TDs.

The Bears definitely have lanced offensive attack in the conference in all three categories, averaging 192 yards rushing, 192 yards passing and 384 yards total offense.

Baylor has two outstanding junior tailbacks in the second in conference rushing yards per game, while Powell left applying for relief. Defense was expected to be Baylor's greatest strength, but the headlines like effect Monday. Nevertheless, the Bears' rushing is especially stingy, yielding per game, good for second in the league. Passing defense is 130.4 yards, or third best in the conference.

The squad does feature linebackers in two-year Mike Singletary, Don Lester Ward.
