Residents hear of solar benefits

The sun can tan your back — and cut 50 percent off your utility costs. Local residents learned how to make the sun work for them Thursday night at the Texas Solar Town Hall, a free public forum.
The experts told the group they can save as much as 50 percent annually on normal heating and cooling costs by using solar energy.
The forum was one of 31 scheduled statewide by the Texas Solar Energy Society (TX-SES) in conjunction with the state energy office of the Texas Energy and Natural Resources Advisory Council.
Daryl Janes, project manager with TX-SES, said a family of five could probably install a solar system in a new house for \$3,000 to \$4,000.
Although this may sound like a lot of money, the system would pay for itself in about six years through lower heating and cooling costs. After that, Janes said, the basic cost of the system will be maintenance.
Two types of solar systems — active and passive — were discussed at the forum. Active systems usually involve hot water heating systems and passive systems usually involve space heating and cooling.
Dr. Peter Jenkins, a professor in Texas A&M University's Mechanical Engineering Department, discussed active solar systems and explained the six generic types of hot water heating systems.
Gary Ashford, an architect from Austin, presented a program of passive solar systems and explained the five generic types of solar systems.
