

Carillons start play Saturday

Bells will be ringing across the Texas A&M University campus starting Saturday. A set of electronic carillons will be presented to the University from the class of 1981. The dedication ceremony will be in front of the Memorial Student Center at 10 a.m. The carillons will replace the old set of chimes which have not been working since 1978. They will ring daily every 15 minutes, at football games and Silver Taps. The \$12,000 carillons are operated by a computer and read music scrolls that include 108 different songs. "We wanted a gift that would be lasting and something that would serve the entire university," said senior class president Jess Mason. "We're dedicating the gift early so that the seniors can enjoy it."

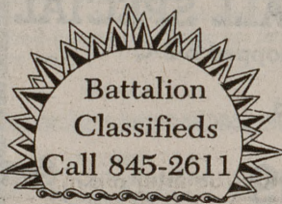

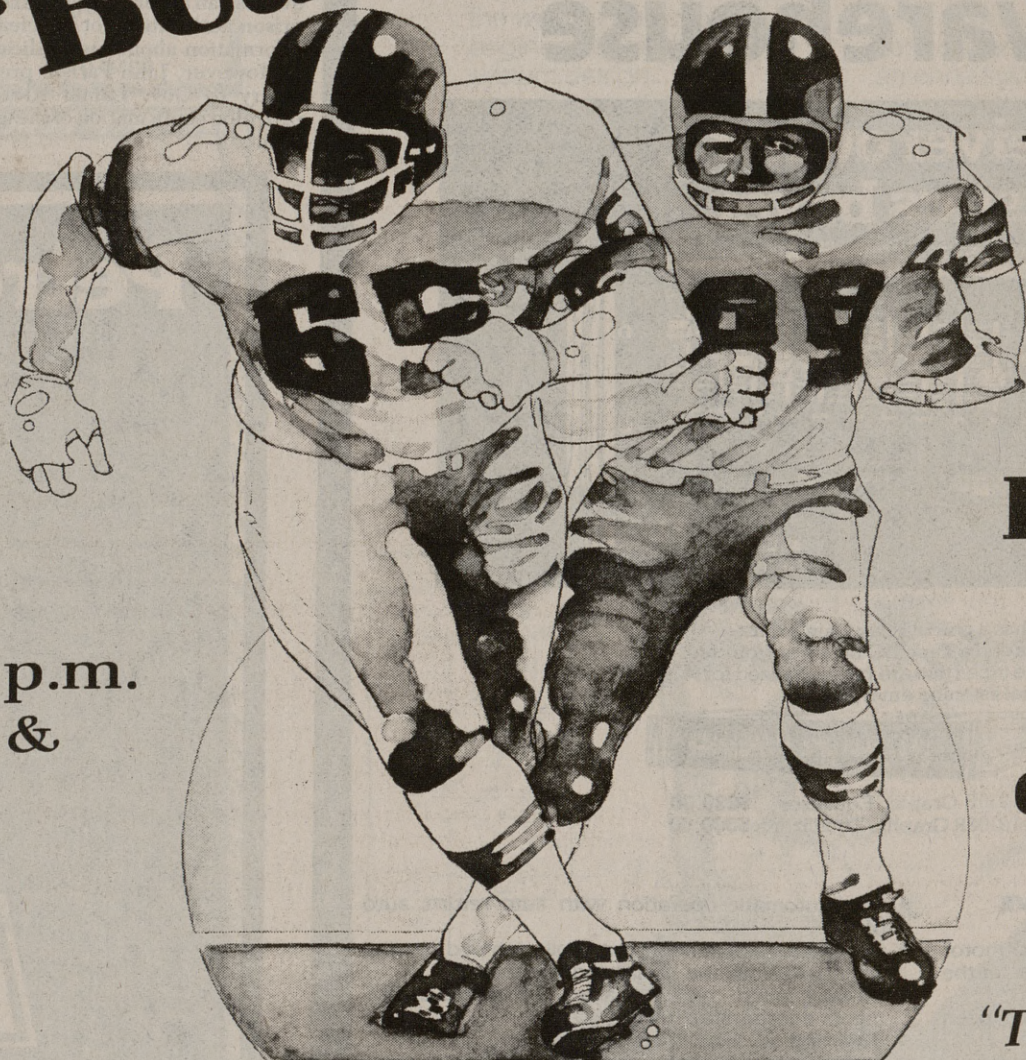
