Holmgreen said Caperton possesses those qualities necessary to represent the "tremendous diversity in this county."


Mark Caperton, Burleson County judge and brother of the senatorial candidate, also gave his endorsement along with 16 other state county judges.

Texas senator 'lashes' at lawyer

GALVESTON — A lawyer has accused Sen. A.R. "Babe" Schwartz, D-Galveston, of striking him on the face at the end of a court hearing on a suit alleging Schwartz owes a bank \$202,000 in overdrafts and loans.

Schwartz, 54, admitted he "lashed out" at Briscoe W. Swan, 32, who represents W.L. Moody & Co. Bankers of Galveston, but disputed whether he hit Swan on the face.

Schwartz dismissed the incident as minor and a reaction to the stress of being on the witness stand Monday from 11 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

But Swan filed a police report and his associate, Robert L. Collins, 28, of Houston, said he wanted Schwartz charged with criminal assault. Collins said Schwartz threatened to kill Swan and that he felt Swan was in danger.

Moody bank operations chief Norman Revie said he saw Schwartz "hit him (Swan) a good crack in the side of

Micro-light planes 'best of both worlds'

SAN MARCOS, Calif. — Micro-light aircraft? "It's the best of both worlds," says Tina Trefethen, 23, a petite veteran of the skies.

"You can soar and thermal like in a hang glider, but you have range, speed and control," she says. "It's like having an airplane you can take home."

Trefethen, a professional pilot and Eipper-formance Inc., one of the companies that build power gliders, says all makers predict micro-flight, which is reportedly safer than its parent sport hang gliding, will be the nation's next recreational boom.

So far, about 5,000 American pilots, have bought the \$3,000 micro-lights.

But now the industry is taking a bite at a much wider market.

Micro-lights are easier to get airborne than hang gliders; they can be foot launched from level ground. And like hang gliders, pilots currently need no license to fly them.

The craft can take off in about 100 feet, cruise at up to 32 mph and land in less space with good wind conditions. Once aloft, the power can be turned off, and the micro-light spirals upwards on a thermal or glide silently.

Even if the motor should fail, the micro-light would function as a regular hang glider.

And although at least one firm requires dealers to give an eight-hour pilot training course to people who buy micro-lights, most flyers intend the craft are so easy to maneuver they can be flown properly without instruction.

The industry's main thrust is sport, but the aircraft has commercial applications, such as camera wrangling, and even military interest.

"I see the day when it will be a common means of transportation," Trefethen says.
