Council elects vice chairman

The Academic Council elected Otto R. Kunze as vice chairman and reactivated the Committee on Broadening Curricula Tuesday.

Kunze is a professor of agricultural engineering. He received his B.S. degree from Texas A&M University in 1951, his Ph.D. from Michigan State University in 1964 and returned to work here in 1956.

Dr. J.M. Prescott, vice president for academic affairs, suggested the reactivation of the Committee on Broadening Curricula. This committee will work on broadening the student's education, Prescott said. It can't be considered a free elective program, he said, but an attempt to get students to take courses in areas not directly connected to their major field of study

The council also approved the addition of 25 new courses, the withdrawal of 110 courses and five changes in course titles.

Changes in the safety engineering curriculum were also approved.
