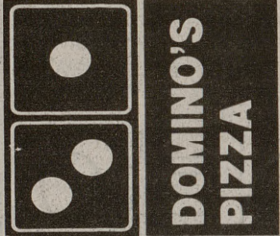

Reagan landslide winner in campus mock election

Texas A&M University students elected Gov. Ronald Reagan to the U.S. Presidency by a wide margin in Wednesday's mock election sponsored by the MSC Political Forum Committee.

The Reagan-George Bush Republican ticket received 67.47 percent of the votes (1,228). Democratic incumbent President Jimmy Carter, running with Vice President Walter Mondale, received 17.41 percent (317) votes.

Independent candidate John Anderson took 10.93 percent (199), and Libertarian Party candidate Ed Clark took 4.17 percent (76).
In the District 5 state senate race, Republican N. A. McNeil beat Democrat Kent Caperton with 922 votes over Caperton's 694.

A closer race gave Democrat Phil Gramm 835 votes to represent the 6th U. S. Congressional District. Republican Dave Haskins received 735 votes in that race.

Students working three booths set up around campus took in 1,866 ballots.

However, Chairman Sam Gillespie said 46 fewer votes were tabulated in the presidential race because that many voters failed to complete their computer card ballots correctly.

Gillespie said his committee was pleased with the voter turnout which indicated student interest in the national elections set for Nov. 4.

The 1,866 votes represent a 5.57 percent turnout of the students currently enrolled at Texas A&M.

The nation's voter turnout figure for the 1976 election was 56.5 percent.

City Council to examine gas service

The College Station City Council will hold a regular council meeting at 7 p.m. in City Hall.

On the agenda are public hearings to examine service standards for Lone Star Gas Co. and to accept proposals for the 1981 Community Development program.

Also on the agenda are a Parks Department request for hotel-motel tax fund money and consideration of industrial development in the city.

Political Forum election results

A total of 1,866 votes were cast yesterday in MSC Political Forum's mock election. Of those, 46 ballots were invalidated for various reasons.

White denies charge on vote fraud issue

AUSTIN — Attorney General Mark White accused a representative of the secretary of state's office Wednesday of lying to a group investigating voting irregularities in Texas.

White said Doug Cady had told the committee the attorney general's office had not followed through on three complaints of voting irregularities referred to his office by the secretary of state.

"Lies, all lies," White said. "I just happened to have been in San Antonio today meeting with investigators from the district attorney's office and Texas Rangers in regard to these matters. I regret Mr. Cady didn't have the good judgment to make inquiry before he let his mouth start operating."

White said officials of the secretary of state's office had presented him with allegations concerning voting irregularities in Bexar, Frio and San Patricio counties.

"The one in Bexar County was already under investigation since shortly after the primary. Since then, two complaints have been filed and a trial has been set," White said.

"In Frio County, before the secretary of state referred his complaint, an investigation already in progress. There is a grand jury for this Friday, and members staff will appear before that jury."

"In San Patricio County the allegations were investigated by members of my staff and presented to grand jury."

"It appears the only one of these efforts is the spokesman of the secretary of state's office," White said. "My understanding is he has the book on 'How They Rig Elections.' I understand the going to send me a complimentary copy."

The hearing Wednesday sponsored by 13 civil rights and public interest organizations.

At the opening of that hearing Secretary of State George Starke promised vigorous investigation of voting law violations, and announced special election inspectors would be utilized during the Nov. 4 election.

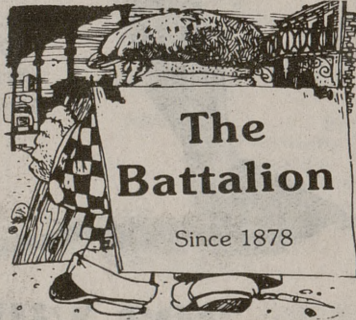
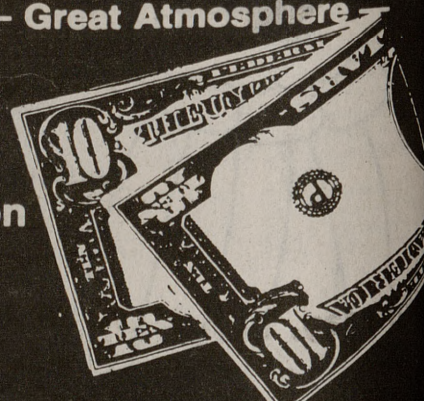
