You must be a senior to wear the Aggie boots. And if you want new

ones, you must have about \$350. Due to the higher price of hides, the cost of senior boots for the Texas A&M University Corps of Cadets has risen signficantly over the past

two years.

John Holick, owner of Holick's Boot Co. & Insignia Inc., a supplier of senior cadet boots, said the price of boots was approximately \$275 in 1978. Today the standard price of his

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
