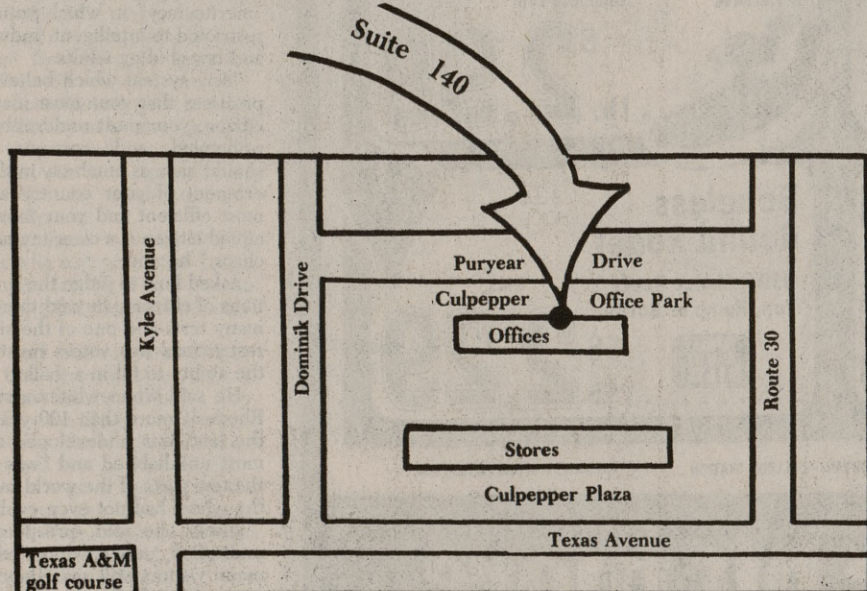

## Scot scholarship offered

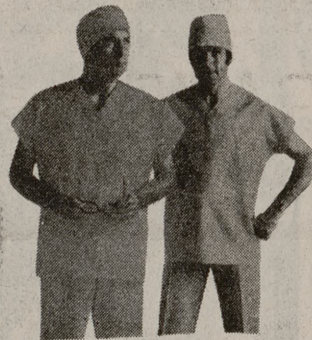
The Academic Services office at Texas A&M University has a number of graduate scholarships available, including a new one for students of Scottish descent who will seek graduate study in Scotland.  
Connie Porter, academic services counselor, said the new Saint An-

draw's Society Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of the applicant's record of academic achievement, participation in extra-curricular activities, responsible leadership, financial need and employment, evidence of Scottish descent and a statement of personal objectives.  
Academic Services will handle screening of applicants, who must have a grade point ratio of 3.2 or above, and select one student to represent Texas A&M University.  
Other graduate scholarships are

also available through the Academic Services office for study in all parts of the United States.

A limited number of scholarships are available to students with the following ethnic backgrounds: Armenian, Polish, Indian, Japanese, Latin American and Dutch.  
Financial aid is also available to students whose parents are affiliated with Knights of Columbus and the Masons. In addition, students who are Lutheran, Episcopalian or Jewish may apply for a limited amount of funding.

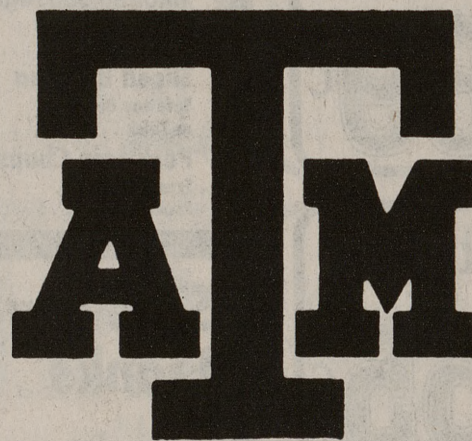
