# Banks could get more auto-tellers

Proposition 1. Faster. More convenient. Banking. Vote YES November 4th. The red, yellow and white billboards on Texas Avenue seem to give the gist of Proposition 1 to the Texas Constitution as seen by the financial community in Texas.  
The billboard space, paid for by Convenience Banking Committee, is typical of the promotion for the passage of the amendment that will authorize banks to set up unmanned teller machines away from the bank. The passage of the proposition is being endorsed by state-wide organizations, as well as local bankers.  
The proposed amendment will permit "the legislature to authorize banks to use unmanned teller

machines within the county or the city of their domicile on a shared basis to serve the public convenience."  
Unmanned teller machines are becoming popular across the state with the introduction of systems like MPACT, ANYTIME and Teller 2. These provide customers the convenience of banking from their car 24 hours a day, seven days a week.  
The use of these automatic teller machines (ATMs) is restricted now by law.  
"The reason why we have to have the amendment is that in the Texas

Constitution, branch banking is prohibited by banks and the general has ruled that unmanned teller machines constitute branch banking," said Ronald Hale, executive president of City National in Bryan. The proposed amendment will remove ATMs from the category of branch banking.  
Credit unions and savings associations are already allowing use of ATMs. Hale said the amendment allows a level playing field for banks.  
"I believe all of us need to be within a similar competitive area here we're all on equal footing," said Calvin Guest, president of the Savings Association of Texas. Hale said he knew of no opposition to the amendment from savings associations.  
However, some restrictions placed on the use of the ATMs of these is the geographic area that the ATM must be placed in a county where the bank is licensed, or, in the event that covers more than one county in that city. The amendment will allow a customer to carry out all functions of banking at the ATM within a geographic area, including cash, deposits, transfers of funds between savings and checking accounts and balance inquiries.  
This restricts the network of ATMs set up in other cities across the state. Customers using ATMs outside the county of their bank are limited to cash dispensals only. Leonard Passmore, counsel to the Texas Bankers Association.  
Another restriction is that the ATM set up under the proposition must be shared with other financial institutions if requested by Hale said this provision will allow a big bank from coming into a town and shutting out smaller banks.
