Texas A&M women's basketball team will host St. Mary's in full scrimmage at 4 p.m. this afternoon in DeWare Fieldhouse.

On Saturday, the Aggies scrimmaged Tyler Junior College and came out on the short end of the score, 78-66. "It (Tyler) was their second scrimmage of the season and they looked two weeks ahead of us," Rapp said about the Aggies first work outside of practice

"We played well for only about eight minutes," she said. One reason the Aggies played sloppy was Rapp substituted her players freely. are in the process of hunting for a combination of five players who can


