ALEXANDRIA, La.—Parents of three Rapides Parish children are challenging school assignments under a controversial desegregation plan said the case could be a confrontation between the federal courts.
"I can see down the road that there will be a classical clash and resolution by the U.S. Supreme Court if it isn't resolved in the courts," J. Minos Simon said Monday.
"We are not at war with the judiciary or the powers of the state of Louisiana. If it does then we'll be on a collision course. A state court hearing was scheduled for Friday." The parents, whose children were assigned to one school or another, threatened to go to court to defend their right to attend their child's school with a guardian.
Simon said he had been in an injunction in state court when the administration of Buckeye High School from denying children entrance. Under U.S. Supreme Court Justice Nauman Scott's order, children should attend their school with a guardian.
Parents of four children said the status of their legal guardian when the start of school so far, he said. But Scott's order had ordered Buckeye to discontinue the state.

The funds would enable states to continue such services as classroom instruction, on-the-job training and job placement for the unemployed and underemployed.
State government would receive the largest allocation, \$67.4 million with New Orleans getting \$15 million and Jefferson Parish \$8 million.
