

Bryan, Temple clash Friday

Unbeaten and seventh-rated Bryan hosts unbeaten and top-rated Temple Friday night in the Texas

schoolboy football showcase game, with the winner advancing to bi-district playoffs and the loser turning to basketball.

"We have a rather polished defense, and Temple has an exceptionally talented offense, and this will be a meeting of the two," Bryan Coach Merrill Green said. "Temple takes the best of all the offenses being run today, puts them all together, and has the personnel to run with it."

Bryan's assignment: "We've just got to come up with a defense to stop all things — I hope we do the right things at the right time," Green said. "I've always believed a good defense could stop a good offense. I just hope I'm right this time."

Temple Coach Bob McQueen says a game like the one Friday night is what Texas high school football is all about.

"It's great to be able to play such a game," he said. "The coaches, the kids and the fans on both sides have been building for this game all year — and it's finally here. You just can't imagine the excitement! After Friday night, we'll know — at least for another year."

Bryan's defense has allowed only two touchdowns all season.

Astros' best season full of action

HOUSTON — The Houston Astros won more games, spent more money, drew more fans and made more headlines than ever before en route to their first baseball championship in 1980. A chronology of the season:
Nov. 15, 1979 — New owner John

McMullen signs California Angels free agent pitcher Nolan Ryan to \$1 million-a-year, three-year contract;

Jan. 31, 1980 — General Manager Tal Smith signs Cincinnati Reds free agent second baseman Joe Morgan to a \$225,000 contract;

April 10 — Terry Puhl leads off season with home run in 3-2 win over Dodgers;

April 12 — Ryan hits first Major League homer but Astros lose for first time 6-5 in 17 innings to Dodgers;

April 19 — J.R. Richard's one-hitter gets him 13th straight win over Dodgers;

April 30 — Astros regain first place as Richard, 4-0, defeats Reds;

May 7 — First baseman Art Howe's jaw fractured by Scott Sanderson's fastball;

May 18 — Ryan's defeat of Philadelphia 3-0, snaps Astros' five-game loss streak, longest of year;

May 21 — Manager Bill Virdon replaces slumping shortstop Craig Reynolds with Rafael Landestoy;

June 17 — Richard leaves Wrigley Field mound complaining of "dead arm."

July 8 — Richard, first Astros pitcher to start an All-Star game, strikes out three and gives up no runs in two innings;

July 14 — Richard removed after 3½-inning performance against Atlanta; tells Virdon his arm

bothered him, tells news media he had an upset stomach;

July 16 — Richard placed on disabled list; Astros order hospital tests;

July 22 — Reynolds' single improves batting average to .200 from low of .185;

July 28 — Astros lead reaches 3½ games, largest of year, when Joe Sambito wins in relief 3-2 at Philadelphia;

July 30 — Richard felled by stroke during Astrodome workout, undergoes life-saving operation to clear blocked artery leading to brain;

Aug. 11 — Virdon shifts Morgan into leadoff spot in batting order with Astros in second place, one-half game behind Dodgers;

Aug. 14 — Morgan holds clubhouse meeting after four straight losses;

Aug. 24 — Astros win 10th straight, longest streak of the season, and hold first by three games as Ryan beats Cubs;

Aug. 26 — Center fielder Cesar Cedeno hits grand slam home run, Astros first since 1977, in 7-2 win over St. Louis;

Aug. 31 — Rookie outfielder Gary Woods, activated at deadline for use in playoffs, drives in a run in 10 of the 12 games he starts through season's end;

Sept. 6 — Jose Cruz' grand slam keys doubleheader win over St. Louis;

Sept. 20 — Astros regain place for good on Ryan's 54th birthday;

Sept. 21 — Patcher Vito Richards' replacement, Jose Francisco but loses bid for two out in the eighth;

Sept. 30 — Crowd of 40,000 breaks home attendance mark of 1965, the year the Astros opened; Astros finish the year 2.27 million.

Oct. 2 — Joe Nickro beats 3-2 and draws team to within one of National League West title with three games to play in Anaheim;

Oct. 3 — Astros within one title, but Dodgers win 3-1 in innings on Joe Ferguson's home run;

Oct. 4 — Another home run, one by Steve Garvey, beats 1-0;

Oct. 5 — Dodgers win game to match Astros 92-70 record; force playoff;

Oct. 6 — Nickro stops Dodgers in four runs; Virdon soaked by players amid champagne in locker room; Cruz ends season as Astros' offensive leader, batting .302 with 185 hits, 40 and 36 stolen bases;

Oct. 7 — Phillies take upper best-of-five National League Championship series on Greg Lougry's home run;

Oct. 8 — Ryan and four teammates beat Phils 7-4 in 10 innings in series;

Oct. 10 — Denny Walling, inning sacrifice fly scores last Astros win first playoff game at the Astrodome 2-1;

Oct. 11 — Phillies use strategy to win 5-3; Cedeno breaks le crossing first base;

Oct. 12 — Ryan, Astros' run lead in the eighth to fall record fourth extra-inning right fielder Terry Puhl's establishes league championship series record .526 batting average (10 for 19);

Oct. 14 — McMullen hires New York Yankees President Al Rosen as general manager; Richard undergoes surgery in California to replace ment of artery leading to right arm;

Oct. 27 — McMullen's Smith, announces Rosen's pitcher Ken Forsch reacts to quest to be traded;

Oct. 28 — McMullen says "not a winner" under Smith's partner David LeFevre says lead outster of McMullen.
