## 'Solid Gold' play begins run

These Texas A&M University students could have been partying or catching up on missed sleep on Fri-day night, but instead they were working as hard as ever.

The students were rehearsing for "The Solid Gold Cadillac," the next Theater Arts Section play, which opens tonight at 8 p.m. in the Rudder Forence. der Forum

"The cast has been very good to work with," he said Monday.

Written by Howard Teichmann and George S. Kaufman, the play enjoyed a 66-week run on Broadway and was just as successful on the road.

"Solid Gold Cadillac" opens tonight and runs through Nov. 15, and will run again Nov. 20 through




