State Clements wants to create southern regional primary

AUSTIN — On his way to meet with the man he helped elect to the presidency, Gov. Bill Clements said Wednesday that he wants to establish a regional primary in the Southwestern states to give them the kind of national political importance the Northeast has now.
"The concept has been born," Clements said. His staff is working on legislation to permit Texas to join New Mexico, Oklahoma, Arkansas and Louisiana in a same-day, March primary.
"It would make the candidates more responsive to that particular region and make them answer the questions of the region," he said.
Clements said the election of Ronald Reagan was not typical and was not an indicator of the power of Texas and the Southwest.
"The country really sent a strong and significant message in this election," he said.
Clements said he has not otherwise changed his legislative program since the election. He denied that he was having trouble finding a suitable sponsor for his wiretap bill, which he just has not decided to introduce it.
The governor also said he wants to give the voters a chance to approve a constitutional amendment giving the budget execution authority to the voters rejected the measure this time because they don't understand it.
Clements will go to Austin Thursday to meet with Reagan and will meet with Reagan's

Criminal appeals judge dies

AUSTIN — W.A. Morrison, 76, a retired judge of the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals, died Tuesday in St. David's Hospital of congestive heart failure.
Morrison served 25 years on the state's highest court for criminal matters, retiring in 1976.
He was graduated from the University of Texas Law School in 1933 and served as district attorney in Milam County as the state's youngest district attorney at the time. He later served as a state district judge.
After five years on the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals, he became the youngest presiding judge of that body in 1955.
Morrison participated in more than 26,000 cases during his term on the criminal appeals court.
Morrison served as an assistant attorney in the Army during World War II, seeking out French aviators.
For the past 26 years he served as lead author in preparation and revision of Willson Criminal Forms, a series of
