The deadline for ordering the Texas A&M senior class ring this semester is **December 5, 1980.** To be eligible to order, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the university. To order please note the following instructions:  
1. A record check must be made for eligibility determination. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the ring clerk, no later than **November 21st.** This may not be done by phone.  
2. Please allow one and a half weeks for the record check to be made.  
3. If mid-term grades are needed to complete any of the above requirements, please bring them along when ready to order. If you no longer have a copy, they may be obtained from your department or advisor.  
4. All ring must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior ring loans are available through the student financial aid office, YMCA building.  
5. Orders are taken between 8:00-11:30 am and 1:00-4:00 pm, Monday through Friday.  
6. Rings ordered between October 27th and December 5th will be delivered approximately March 12, 1980.

## Mafia touched by law — finally

LOS ANGELES — The prosecutor in the trial of five reputed West Coast Mafia leaders says their convictions on charges of racketeering and extortion show the Mafia is not beyond the reach of the law. "This case has destroyed the myth that the Mafia cannot be successfully prosecuted," Jim Henderson, head of the Organized Crime Study Force in Los Angeles, said after the convictions. He further hailed the convictions as a warning "message to all people in organized crime." All five defendants, allegedly leaders of the Southern California Mafia, were convicted on racketeering charges involving attempts to extort money from gamblers, bookmakers and pornographers. Two of the defendants also were convicted of extorting \$7,500 from an FBI undercover sting operation. However, three of the defendants, charged with plotting to murder Frank "The Bomb" Bompensiero, the San Diego mob chief who was fatally shot near a telephone booth in 1977, were acquitted on those charges. All five defendants — Dominick Brooklier, 66, identified in testimony as boss of the Los Angeles family of La Cosa Nostra; Samuel Sciorino, 61, an alleged underboss; Louis Tom Dragna, 60, a reputed one-time acting boss; Michael Rizzitello, 53, a mob "capo" or lieutenant; and Jack LoCicero, 68, a mob "consigliere," or counselor — stood silently as the verdicts were read. Several members of their families sat rigidly in the front row of the courtroom. Some of the wives wept. The jurors reached the verdicts Friday evening after eight days of deliberation. Testimony lasted three weeks in the trial hailed by law enforcement officers as the most significant judicial crackdown on the Mafia's activities in many years. The defendants will remain free on bail pending sentencing Jan. 12 before U.S. District Judge Terry Hatter Jr.

## Surrogate mother fee under \$10,000

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — Dr. Richard Levin, physician for the Illinois woman who recently bore a child for a Louisville couple, says the surrogate mother was paid less than \$10,000 under a legal contract. "She received substantially less than \$10,000," Levin told a news conference. "And I received no fee for this case whatsoever." The surrogate mother, who used the pseudonym Elizabeth Kane, gave birth to an 8-pound, 10-ounce, 20-inch boy at Louisville's Audubon Hospital a week from last Sunday. The birth — the first in the nation in which the surrogate mother was paid — was kept secret until it leaked out Thursday night. Kane answered a news advertisement a year ago seeking a woman to carry a child, at a fee, for a Louisville couple unable to conceive because the wife was infertile because of blocked tubes. The surrogate was impregnated by artificial insemination with the husband's sperm. The identity of the couple was also withheld. Though Levin, president of Surrogate Parenting Associates Inc., performed this surrogate parenting case free of charge, he said other such packages will cost childless couples over \$20,000, which includes legal and medical fees. Since March 2, Dr. Levin said, between 12 and 15 Louisville women have become surrogate mothers to couples who have chosen this child bearing alternative. "That's the name of the game is surrogating: We've given people another choice in parenting," Levin said. "It's a viable alternative." Kane, 38, who has three other children, was to attend the birth with Levin but decided to return to her Illinois home. "I couldn't convince her to come," Levin said. "She was just getting homesick and drove back Friday." Levin said the delivery took place eight months and seven days after Kane's first insemination.

## 3-year-old clings to life after plunge

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. — Scott Hinson, a 3-year-old who plunged into Attorney General Steve Clark's swimming pool and stayed underwater for 30 minutes, clung to life Sunday in critical condition. Hinson, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Tommy Hinson of Cabot, Ark., was in Arkansas Children's Hospital. "He's still within the range of what doctors classify as critical condition," a hospital spokesman said. "There has been no real change in the past 24 hours." Clark met with the Hinson family to try to determine how the child got past an eight-foot fence that surrounds the pool. Hinson was chasing his pet cat Thursday when he fell in the pool and did not surface. Cabot police, their search hampered by icy temperatures and murky water, rescued him half an hour later and revived him with heat massage and mouth-to-mouth resuscitation.
