New x-ray mode Bar lessens radiation life

DALLAS — A new diagnostic technique for chest X-rays, the more common type of X-ray examination, reduces radiation exposure. patients as much as 80 percent, medical authorities anno

The new technique allows the radiation reduction without loss picture quality, said Dr. John E. Campbell, chief radiologist at the University of Toronto's Sunnybrook Medical Center, where the equip Campbell, in Dallas for the annual meeting of the Radiologic

Society of North America, said current technology in use across the United States already produces relatively small doses of radiation the patient. But he said any reduction in radiation levels was an improvement

'The best radiation is no radiation," said Campbell.
Scientists don't know for sure what the dangers of low less radiation are but evidence shows radiation in large quantities leads

He said the new system, which would cost a hospital about \$125,00 to install, reduced radiation levels from an average 21 millinds

radiation to 3.5. 'For the man on the street, it means he could have six chest X-ray and get no more radiation than if he had one under the old technolog Campbell said. "And because the exposure time is also reduced in 17-20 milliseconds to 2-3 milliseconds) it will be great for pediatric, it the kids who can't keep still and have to have repeated X-rays untilone

Dr. Harry S. Shulman, a colleague of Campbell's, said the new technique also would prove particularly useful for diagnosing problem involving pacemakers implanted in heart patients' chests.

He said that since the pacemaker is moved about by the motion the heart, it was often difficult to get clear X-rays of it. The newsystem would facilitate obtaining clearer pictures.
