Refugees terrorized by gangs

FORT CHAFFEE, Ark.—gangs of young thugs, often with homemade machetes and bunk tools, roam the nation's refugee center at night to terrorize the population and settle old officials say.

Violence at the camp has increased in the past two weeks, FBI agents and the latest wave during the weekend left one refugee in a condition Wednesday with a fractured skull. Two more Cubans were beaten and a fourth was slain. Gangs "are a bigger problem than anyone in the State Dept. administration wants to admit," a civilian employee who works within the compound. They want to scare away sponsors something has to be done.

No one contends that a handful of the 6,900 refugees remaining at Fort Chaffee are a gangland-style violence in the chances for other refugees sponsored out of the camp.

What results, some observers is a vicious cycle for many refugees: Gangs damage the reputation of refugees and impact sponsorship chances, which makes some refugees frustrated and violent.

"We have a ready-made here," the Arkansas Gazette's law enforcement official says. "The Cubans have come here for a better life and that hasn't worked. I don't think we'll see anything like the (summer riots), but an undercurrent of frustration is anger."

SENIOR RING ORDER PROCEDURE
The deadline for ordering the A&M senior class ring this year is December 5, 1980. To be eligible to order, an undergraduate must have at least ninety semester hours, with 30 in A&M and be in good standing at university. To order please follow these instructions:
1. A record check must be made for eligibility determination. Your name, major and ID number must be on the record check, with the ring clerk, no later than November 21st. This may be done by phone.
2. Please allow one and a half weeks for the record check to be processed.
3. If mid-term grades are not complete any of the above requirements, please bring them when ready to order. If you no longer have a copy, they will be obtained from your department advisor.
4. All ring must be paid for when the order is placed. Ring loans are available through the student financial aid Y.M.C.A. building.
5. Orders are taken between 11:30 am and 1:00-4:00 pm, day through Friday.
6. Rings ordered between October 27th and December 5th will be delivered approximately March 1980.
(Orders are also being taken from graduate students receiving degrees in December '80. In addition to a record check, the \$11.00 graduation receipt must be presented to the ring clerk when ordering.)
