**Ags entertain TSU**

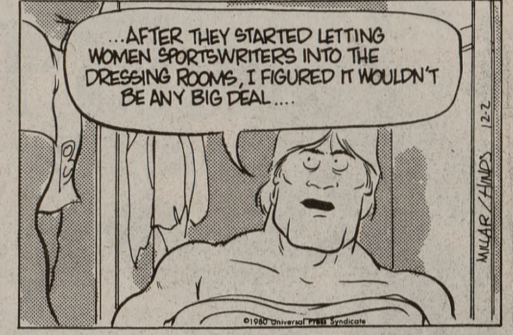
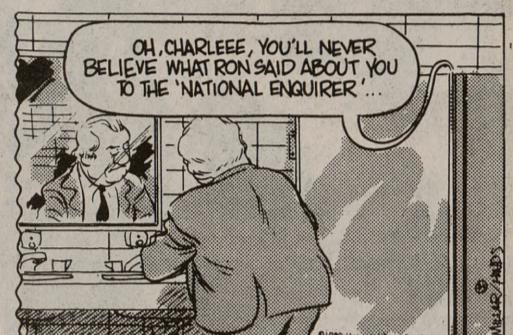

Texas Southern, led by sophomore sensation Harry "Machine Gun" Kelly, invades G. Rollie White tonight to take on the 15th-ranked Aggies starting at 7:30 p.m. Kelly, the nation's third leading scorer of a year ago with a 29-point game average, leads a potent tiger attack which can score from anywhere on the court. He is as good as any scorer in the country," said assistant coach Barry Davis about the 6'7 Kelly, "and he can put the ball in the hole."

Crawford combined for 43 points in the Tigers season opening 77-72 victory over Paul Quinn, while the Aggies opened up the season with a 66-57 win over Maine in Bangor. Davis said the Tigers are a disciplined ball club on offense, but if the fast break is there, they will take it. The Tigers, who won the NAIA National Championship in 1977, are coached by Robert Moreland who had his worst season ever last year with a 9-17 record. But better things are expected for the Tigers this year as all five starters in the starting unit are 6'8 forward Michael Anderson, 5'10 guard Kenneth Hillard and 6'9 center Patrick Johnson. Moreland has some height off the bench in the form of seven-footer

Ronnie Cavena, a senior out of Beaumont. The Tigers are quick and could present some problems for the tall and talented Aggies in the form of a full-court press. "We're going to have to face it sooner or later," Metcalf said of the TSU full-court press. "We're going to start with a one guard, four big man offense. After that we'll bring Reggie off the bench." The fans will be in for a treat as SWC defensive player of the year, Rynn Wright, matches up with "Machine Gun" Kelly in the man-to-man defense. **Astro's Cruz hurt playing in Puerto Rico**

HOUSTON — Houston Astros' most valuable player Jose Cruz has suffered a knee injury of undetermined severity playing baseball in Puerto Rico, a team spokesman said Monday. Cruz, who batted .302 with 91 RBI last season, was injured Saturday as he slid into second base. He was flown to Houston later this week for an examination by the Astros team doctor. The spokesman said Cruz suffered a "partial lateral tear of the medial collateral ligament" in his left knee and was advised by a doctor in Puerto Rico to stay off it for three weeks.



**Rogers wins Heisman**

NEW YORK — Running back George Rogers of South Carolina, the nation's leading rusher, today named winner of the Heisman trophy, given annually by the Downtown Athletic Club to the best college football player in the nation. Defensive end Hugh Green of Pittsburgh finished second and freshman running back Herschel Walker of Georgia was third in a balloting of 1,050 sports writers and broadcasters from across the nation. Rogers, the first South Carolina player to win the award, received 179 first place votes and 1,128 points; Green got 179 first place mentions and 861 points and Walker received 179 first place votes and 683 points. Rogers was named runner-up by 10 voters. Other finalists were Jim McMahon, Ohio State quarterback Art Schlichter, Nebraska running back Jarrod Redwine, UCLA defensive back Anthony Carter, Baylor line-

man Mike Singletary and Illinois quarterback Dave Wilson. Rogers, who finished seventh in the Heisman voting last year, is the eighth straight running back to win the award. A 6-foot-2, 220-pounder, Rogers rushed for 1,781 yards in 11 games this season — an average of 161.9 per game — and scored 14 touchdowns. He finished his NCAA record with 4,958 yards rushing, good for fourth place on the NCAA's all-time list. His total trails only California and Tony Dorsett (6,082 at Pittsburgh), all former Heisman winners, on the career list. Rogers also was the nation's most consistent rusher. He has gone over the 100-yard rushing mark in 21 straight games and is South Carolina's all-time total offense leader without ever having thrown a pass. Oddly, Rogers and Green will be going head-to-head in the Gator Bowl on Dec. 29 when the Gamecocks (8-3) meet the fourth-ranked Panthers (10-1). No less a booster of Rogers for the Heisman Trophy was Walker. Earlier this season Rogers played against

Walker, and although the freshman outgained the senior, Walker had nothing but praise for his opponent. "I'd vote for Rogers (for the Heisman) if I could," Walker said at the time. "I hope he wins it." Several sports writers admitted they did not consider Walker because he was only a freshman and had three years of eligibility remaining.

A&M will be the home team against TCU, and will be splitting the gate receipts with SMU.

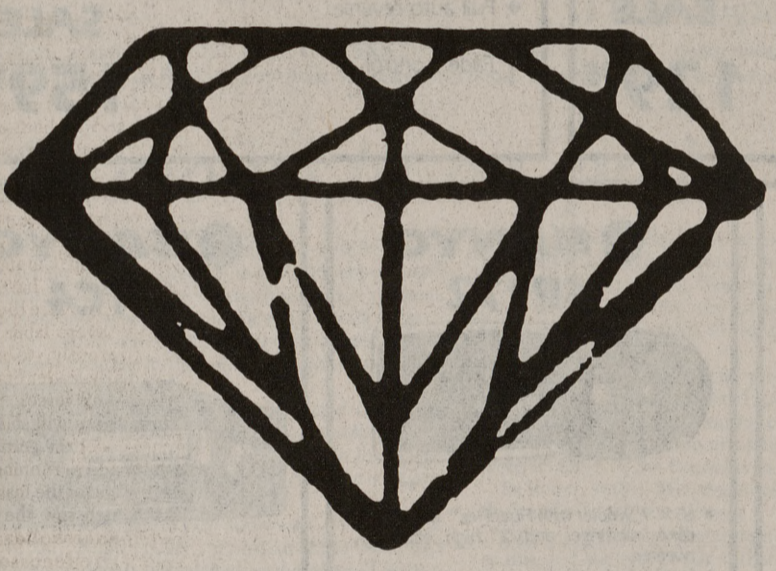
