# SWC basketball action gets hotter for team coach

Here's a wrapup of SWC college basketball action Thursday night:

Southwest Texas State (68) at Rice (67) — Southwest Texas' Harold Howard scored on a 10-foot jumper with three seconds remaining and Rice's Kenny Austin missed a last-second foul shot to give Southwest Texas a

The real turnaround in the game was with 7:07 to play on a technical foul called on Rice's Donald Bennett for overguarding. Southwest Texas made both free throws, then got the ball out of bounds, and Rice's 10point lead began to vanish.

The Bobcats had tied the game at 61 with 5:01 to play and then Howard got two consecutive baskets to put them ahead. The lead changed hands down to the last second.

Rice's Bobby Tudor hit a 15-foot jump shot with 12 seconds to play to put Rice ahead 67-66, then Howard's jump shot gave the Bobcats the final

Rice is now 1-3 and Southwest TCU (63) at Notre Dame (79)-

Senior captains Kelly Tripucka and Orlando Woolridge combined for 41 points to lift Notre Dame to a 79-63 victory over Texas Christian Univer-Tripucka scored 22 points and led

the Irish with 10 rebounds. Woolridge scored 19 points and sparked the Irish to an early 10-2 lead. He collected 15 of his points in the first

TCU sophomore guard Darrel Browder kept the Horned Frogs in the game with 12 first-half points, including five in a row before intermission, but Notre Dame held a 44-30 halftime advantage. Browder finished the game as team high scorer with 14 points.

In addition to Woolridge and Tripucka, freshman Center Joe Kleine scored 11 points and hauled in seven

The Irish, 2-1, stormed to a 20 point advantage, 65-45, midway through the second half. TCU, 1-3, managed to pull within 11 points with two minutes remaining, but seven unanswered Notre Dame points sealed the victory.

Western Kentucky (58) at Texas Tech (68)—Texas Tech, behind the 24-point second half scoring surge of junior forward Jeff Taylor, erased a 30-22 halftime deficit and turned back Western Kentucky, 68-58. The Red Raiders shot a paltry 33

percent (10-of-30) in the first half and could not keep pace with the taller Hilltoppers. Western Kentucky rode the shooting of 6-10 center Craig McCormack, who had six points in the final eight minutes of the first half, to their eight-point

advantage at intermission.

But Taylor put on an all-around performance in the second 20 minutes of play, scoring on a variety of inside shots and outside jumpers. Taylor also had six steals and four rebounds in the decisive second half.

Joining Taylor in double figures for Tech were Clarence Swannegan and Steve Smith with 10 points each. McCormack paced the Western Kentucky attack with 18. Mike Reese chipped in 12 for the loser. Tech is now 2-1 while Western Kentucky dropped to 2-2.
