Pre-Christmas Scots take victory off everything with great finish

United Press International The incredible Dallas Highland Park rally, which began with nine seconds left in the third quarter of its Texas schoolboy Class 5A quarterfinal game with Plano on Saturday, continued Sunday at Love Field Airport in Dallas.

Meeting to determine where next weekend's sixth-rated Odessa Per-mian-Highland Park semifinal game would be played, the seventh-rated Scots won the crucial coin flip and thus will be able to host the game in Texas Stadium.

"We told each other at the half that we couldn't give up, and no one did," said Moerschell. "We went out there that last time knowing it was our last chance. We knew we could do it.
