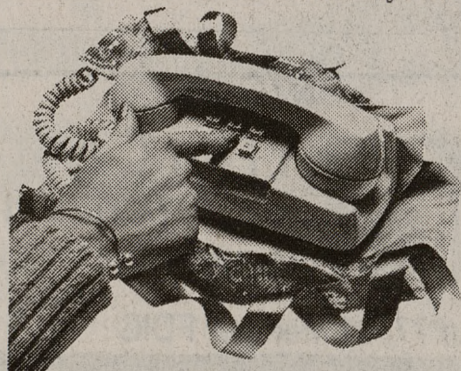

## Conference on women held

Women in development — it is not a new phrase coined by feminists, but involves women who live and work in developing countries.

These women often work in agricultural occupations and provide for most of their family's needs.

In some nations 60 to 70 percent of farmers are women, Dr. Pamela Horne, strengthening grant coordinator at Texas A&M University, said.

Many developing countries have foreign personnel that are sent to help develop the country's economy or an aspect of it. Horne, women in development coordinator in the International Programs office, said that one problem with such personnel is that it usually consists of men who often refer only to other men and not to women.

When women are involved in the economy just as much or more than men that could be a problem.

A recent conference on women in development addressed just this and other women in development issues.

The two-day conference, which was sponsored by Texas Tech and

Texas A&M, sought to increase awareness of problems in international work and women's culture.

Speakers at the conference were from several universities and representatives of the Agency for International Development, Washington, D.C. AID is an agency which funds international programs, including the International Strengthening Grant Program.

Two home economics students who spoke at the conference represented Texas A&M's Agricultural Extension Service.

Dr. Nancy Granovsky, made recommendations on how conference participants can carry their concerns about women in development to their universities.

One of her recommendations was to arrange a yearly field experience of a team of women observing AID projects to expose them to international work in that country.

Granovsky also strongly encouraged participants to get involved in sponsor campus activities on development issues to increase awareness of other technical personnel.

## Guard certification course to be offered

A basic certification course for private security guards will be conducted Dec. 8-10 at Texas A&M University's Bryan Research Extension Center.

The 30-hour course covers instruction in laws that regulate the private security officer, as well as instruction on the Texas penal code, first aid, laws of arrest and firearms. All training materials and .38 caliber ammunition for firearms familiarization are provided in the \$75 fee.

The training is provided by the Law Enforcement and Security Training Division of the Training Extension Service of the Texas A&M University.

"A person does not have to be presently employed as a security officer to take the course," said Jesse, a course instructor, said. Certification allows the individual to carry a sidearm during work and from the place of employment.

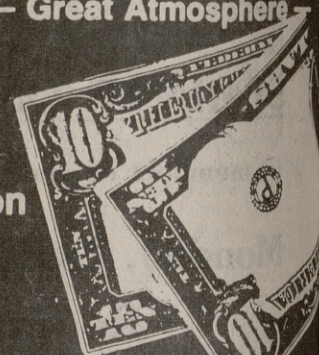
