

Kansas murder law questioned

ALMA, Kan. — A peculiar state law has allowed murder charges to be filed against a youth whose brother was killed during an apparent attempted robbery, even though the defendant was not there.
The law, which stipulates those who aid in a felony are as guilty as the person who commits the act, led to felony murder charges against John Cochran, 18 and a 17-year-old youth who accompanied him. His 16-year-old brother James was killed during the weekend.
State law says a killing that occurs during the commission of a felony or an attempt to commit a felony is first-degree murder.
Crawford County Attorney Mike McCurdy argued that the two teenagers had committed a felony in planning the attempted robbery, a killing occurred, so they should be charged with murder.
Crawford County authorities said the three teen-agers planned to break into an electronics store, not knowing that the store's proprietor intended to sleep there.

Holiday trim on poison list

LOS ANGELES — Christmas may be hazardous to your health. Poisons, some of them deadly, abound in the traditional trappings of the holiday season, the director of the Poison Information Center said Saturday.
Holly, mistletoe and poinsettia all contain poisons that are lethal or nearly so. Wrapping paper, fireplace crystals and Christmas trees, too, present dangers, especially to children, according to the director of the Los Angeles County Medical Association's Poison Information Center.
"The Christmas season is one of the busiest for the Poison Center," Corrine Ray, said, "because there are so many potentially hazardous products in the home during the holidays."
The center receives about 36,000 calls a year from people with poison problems, and the calls step up during the holiday season.
"Unfortunately, youngsters are the ones usually victimized," she said in an interview. "Children will eat anything and everything on their hands."
High on the danger list are holly, mistletoe and poinsettia.
Holly contains a chemical called saponin, with the berries even more concentrated. Some saponin can cause central nervous system depression.
Mistletoe is extremely toxic. Just one or two of the white berries can be lethal to a child or a family pet.
Mistletoe contains several plants which increase heart rate and causes muscle contractions, hallucinations and convulsions.
Poinsettia contains a chemical called euphorbin which causes gastrointestinal disturbances, the sap from the plant irritates the mucous of the eyes if it is rubbed in the eyes it causes temporary blindness.
Even the oils in fresh-cut cedar trees can upset a child's stomach, but are not likely to harm, Ray said.
Tree decorations are another serious problem, she said. Laws forbid the use of lead in ornaments, but the lead is frequently carbon tetrachloride, a highly toxic solvent.
