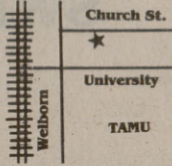

Aggie track teams take third

The 1981 track season began a little sluggish for the Texas A&M Uni-

versity track teams this weekend, but in a few spots, there were promising signs.

The Aggies competed in the Sooner Indoor Relays at the Myriad Arena in Oklahoma City.

The Aggie men were led by Olympian Jimmy Howard, who claimed the high jump crown with a 7-0½ leap.

Head Men's Coach Charlie Thomas had labeled the meet as only a warm-up, and the Aggies had very little warm-up time before heading for Oklahoma.

One pleasant surprise was a second-place showing by Rod "Rocket" Richardson in the 60-yard dash. The freshman from Louisiana streaked to a 6.23 time.

In other action, Billy Busch finished fourth in the 60-yard high hurdles (7.61), Leslie Kerr took third in the 440-yard dash (49.21) and Kevin McGinnis was third in the shot put with a 58-2½ effort.

Baylor won the men's meet with 89 points, followed by SMU with 56 and the Ags with 52.

In women's action, the Aggies were third with 58 points behind

Oklahoma with 116 and Texas Woman's University with 74. The Aggie showing was a good one due to the fact only seven A&M women competed.

Ellen Smith finished second in the 600-yard dash with a 1:28.63 clocking and Sandra Cooper was second in the 300-yard dash with a 36.22 time. Suzanne Sheffield was second in the mile in 5:14.7. The mile relay team of Cooper, Smith, Evelyn Smith and Jana Raves took second in 4:03.5.

The Aggie men and women will next compete in the LSU Indoor Quad in Baton Rouge, La. Jan. 24.

Students who want to add long distance calling privileges to their room should sign up at our desk located on the second floor of the Memorial Student Center, Tuesday, January 20 through Friday, January 23 from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m.

You should check with our desk if:

1. You want long distance service and did not sign up last semester.
2. You are moving from a room where you had long distance service and have not notified our business office. (Remember, if you do not report your move, you are still responsible for long distance calls made from your previous room telephone.)
3. You have any questions regarding long distance service.

New rate structures require all subscribers to pay a twelve (\$12) dollar service order charge. If the long distance service is new, there will also be an eight (\$8) dollar service connection charge.

No deposits are required for new signups unless past paying habits warrant a deposit. Students who signed up for toll service last semester will continue to have long distance privileges, provided you did not cancel your service last semester.

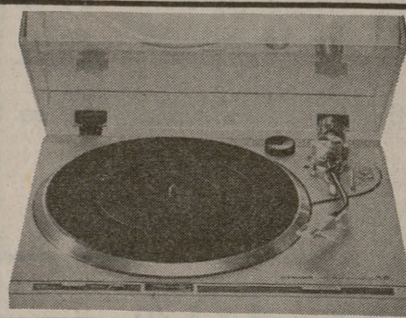

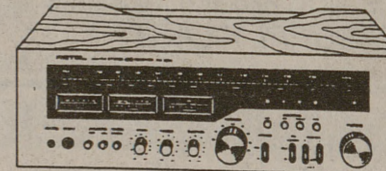
