the catalog. There are also cross-references that refer catalog users from the old listings to the new ones, making them easier to find.

Payne said planning for the catalog changes began about two years ago after publication of the second edition of the Anglo-American Cataloging Rules.

The rules, used by the Library of Congress and many academic librar-ies in the United States, Canada, Great Britain and Australia, is a listing of standard rules for library cataloging which also outlines changes in previous rules as well.

The libraries in these countries are attempting to standardize library cataloging by making the changes outlined in the rules. Payne said no complaints or prob-lems have resulted from the

changes. She said she does not foresee any major problems resulting from the catalog changes.

A list of headings used in the card catalog, as well as those changed by staff will help anyone who has trouble understanding the changes.
