Reagan praised for ending oil controls

United Press International Texas energy producers Wednes-day hailed President Reagan's termination of petroleum price controls as the first step toward putting the oil industry on the same footing as all other U.S. industries.

'We commend President Reagan and his administration for putting an immediate end to federal price con-trols on crude oil," said Edwin L. Cox of Dallas, president of the Texas Mid-Continent Oil & Gas Associa-
