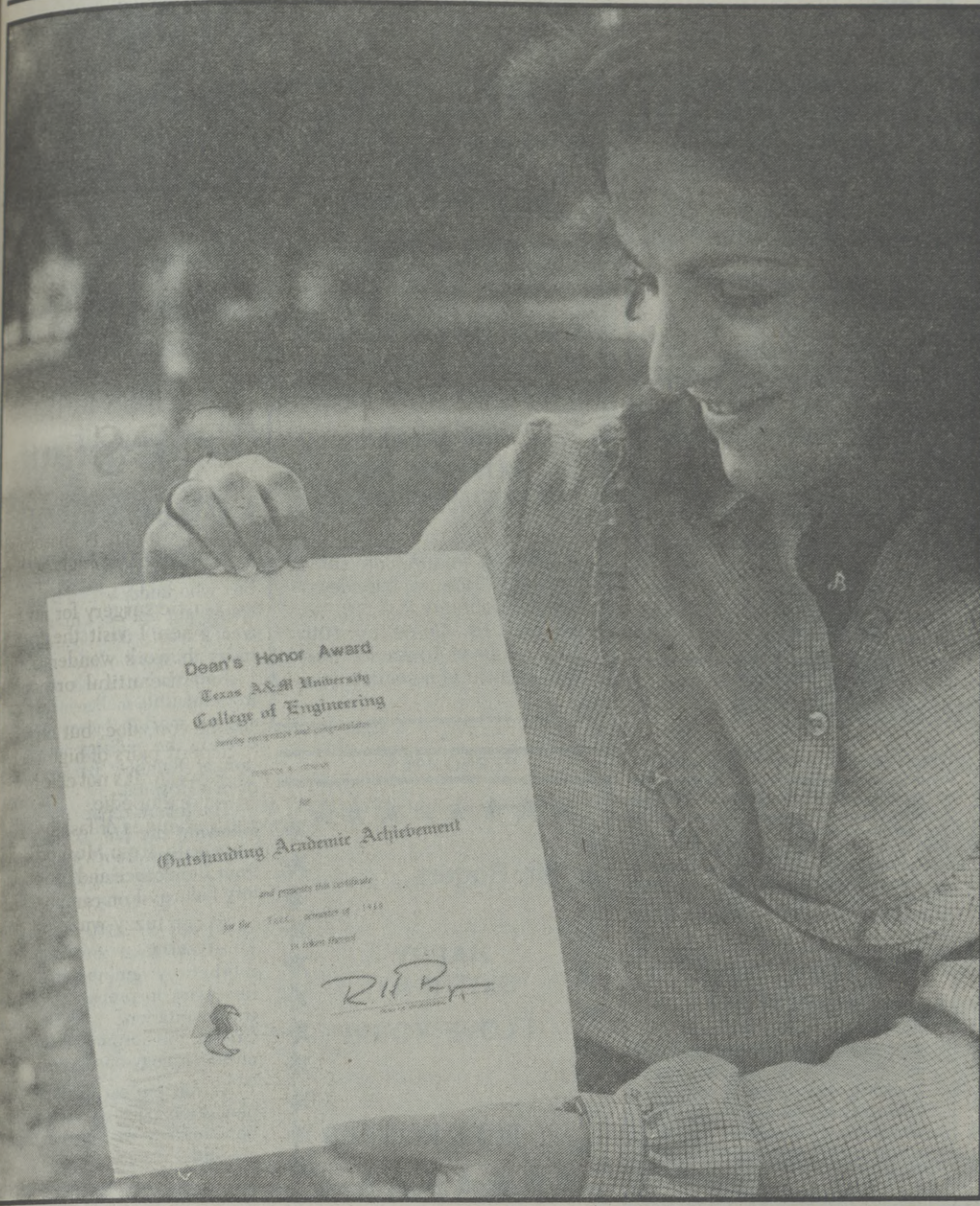

Women engineers begin conference today

Nuts and bolts are more than tools, as 500 visiting Texas high school students will discover today and Saturday. The theme of the sixth annual Engineering Conference at Texas A&M University, sponsored by the Society of Women Engineers (SWE), is "The Nuts and Bolts of Engineering," said Peggy Fisher, conference publicity chairman. The 1981 conference is designed to teach students about engineering, Fisher said. The group will be about 60 percent female. This is the first year males will attend, she said. Along with the conference Saturday will be an industrial exhibition in the H. B. Zachry Engineering Center lobby. Texas Instruments, Procter and Gamble, and Alcoa are three of the companies that will have booths set up to provide information and answer questions that students may have, Fisher said. Thirteen Texas A&M engineering societies will also have booths in the

Zachry lobby and all University students are invited to attend the exhibit from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. A banquet welcoming the students tonight will be held in the Memorial Student Center featuring Dr. Anthony W. England, geophysicist and astronaut for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), Fisher said. Following the banquet, students will participate in a design contest trying to use engineering skills and available materials to design something, Fisher said. Last year participants in the contest had to use paper and paper towels to design a sailboat, she said. Saturday the visiting students will tour the different engineering departments and each of them will be asked to choose three departments to visit. Tours of the University campus will also be available. Also on Saturday the students will attend panel discussions. "One panel will consist of professional engineers and the other will be students in engineering," Fisher said.
