# Crocodile boot orders won't be filled by Florida business

**MIAMI** — The boots Robert Smith sells to urban cowboys are the sort that appeal to the carriage trade. But his ad for genuine crocodile boots in a Miami newspaper — The Herald — on Friday lured a different breed of customer — wardens of the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission.

Now all five pairs of boots, made by the T. O. Stanley firm of El Paso are on their way to a state warehouse, where they will be permanently impounded.

Smith figures it cost him \$12,500. Another shipment of crocodile boots from the Stanley firm arrived Saturday.

"I had to refuse it," Smith said in a telephone interview. "And there's more. Another shipment is en route. When that one gets here, I'll have to refuse it, too," he said in a telephone interview.

He said he spent the morning phoning customers who had placed orders for crocodile boots he couldn't fill.

"I had to tell one man who left a \$1,000 deposit he'd

be getting his money back. He said he'd rather get boots."

Smith said before he ordered the crocodile boots, he went to El Paso and checked the Stanley firm's records to make certain the crocodiles had been imported legally.

"They came from New Guinea. Everything was in order. There is no shortage of crocodiles in New Guinea," he said.

Smith then checked with an officer of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, who told him federal law prohibits import of crocodile hides from New Guinea.

"I didn't know about the Florida law. I didn't know there was any difference. I thought there was only an endangered species list," he said.

But there are only about 200 crocodiles remaining in the U.S. and all of them live in south Florida. Florida has a law prohibiting sale of crocodile hides and products made from them anywhere within its borders.

Smith said he had the five pairs of crocodile boots in the store for a month but hadn't sold any before they appeared.

# Phantom state trooper in custody

**NEW ORLEANS** — He fooled quite a few police officers and even an FBI agent or two, but state police finally solved the three-month-old mystery of the phantom trooper with red hair.

In fact, police said it was Donald W. Artrup's red hair, red mustache and red muttonchop sideburns that helped put an end to his fun impersonating an officer.

When he was arrested Saturday, the burly Artrup told state troopers

the stolen uniform and badge made him feel proud.

"It made him feel good and he was proud of it," officers said.

A raid on the suspect's residence turned up a missing state police windbreaker, a shirt with sergeant's stripes and a rare solid silver badge fashioned in the shape of Louisiana.

"We got first wind of this guy in St. Bernard, where our man on the beat kept getting asked about the 'new trooper,'" said state police spokesman Wallace Gettys.

"We thought maybe he was a new recruit sent from Baton Rouge."

However, reports of his mustache and sideburns indicated the 'trooper' knew little of regulations. The state police dress code forbids facial hair on uniformed officers.

In addition to the misdemeanor charge of impersonating an officer, Artrup was booked on a felony

charge of possession of stolen property.

Gettys said Artrup may be responsible for several brutality complaints against state troopers.

"We would like to be notified anyone who came in contact with him so we can clear the air," he said.

St. Bernard sheriff's deputies even an FBI agent who talked with the suspect in a bar believed him to be a real trooper.

"He was a pretty good con man," Gettys said.

The ruse finally went a bit too far, however, and led to Artrup's arrest. He was captured when he listed to state police on a job application as most recent employer.

The pieces fell together when a prospective employer, an apartment manager in Metairie, La., checked the reference with state police recommendation was not with Artrup got.

# Arab predicts U.S. policies will shift away from Israel

**DALLAS** — Dr. M.T. Mehdi, president of the New York-based American-Arab Relations Committee, predicted Sunday that public opinion will force the Reagan administration to lean toward the Arab world and away from Israel.

Mehdi spoke to about 50 Arab-American leaders at Dallas-Fort Worth Regional Airport, where he stopped on a nationwide tour to organize Arab community leaders for the 1984 election.

"The American people are recognizing that their future is linked to the Arab world, and not to the bankrupt state of Israel," Mehdi said.

In terms of trade, strategic location and energy needs of America, the Arab world is of utmost importance for the future of Western civilization.

Hence, President Reagan will have to be closer to the Arabs."

The Arab-American Relations Committee was organized in 1964 and claims 45,000 members.

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
