NTSU's one bell welcomes hostages back

United Press International DENTON — North Texas State University joined churches and schools across the country in greeting the released hostages with bells — or rather with bell.

For the first time in six years, the carillon in the Administration Building clock tower was played for about 15 minutes after NTSU President Frank E. Vandiver heard of the hostage release.

But making the carillon ring was not easy. Only one of three musicians trained to play the instrument remained at NTSU, and worse, only one note — middle C — could be played.

"We just played a note that would work," said Robert Rogers, a pianist in the NTSU music department. Rogers and two other faculty members were taught to play the CelestaChime Electronic Carillon when it was installed in 1956.

Rogers left most of the playing for the release to Doug Prewitt, an engineering technician at NTSU's physical plant.

"Doug and I worked to get the thing operating manually, and then I had to go to a meeting," said Rogers. "I told him to just count 1-2-3-4-5 and push down the key. At least we made some happy noise on this occasion."

The carillon was used on many big occasions at NTSU, Rogers said. Perhaps the most inspired concert, with the exception of the hostage release, was celebration in 1961 of North Texas being designated a university.

"We used to play it every graduation, for a full week before Christmas, and on University Day when we celebrated NTSU's anniversary," he said. "We used to play it when special groups were on campus, too."

"Until 10 or 12 years ago, when the carillon broke down, I taught a course in it, and we gave a scholarship to a music student who assisted me in all the work of keeping it going."

Students who took Rogers' course regularly performed recitals on the carillon.

"Interest in playing the carillon died out when it got to where it didn't play well," he said.

Named the McConnell Memorial Tower and Carillon for past NTSU president W. Joseph McConnell, the carillon was a gift of former students and friends.
