# Win over Borg is worth \$25,000

TORONTO — It's getting to be like bounty hunting.

Being the man who last beat Bjorn Borg for some time been an honor almost greater than winning a tournament championship. Now, in one case at least, it pays better too.

Sponsors of a \$500,000 tennis extravaganza opening in Toronto Wednesday have taken the logical next step and made victory over

Bjorn Borg a major event in its own right, a prospect with crowd appeal. They have offered a \$25,000 reward to anyone in the tournament who can defeat Borg and have recruited a field of opponents whose style is most likely to work against Borg's incredible consistency.

John McEnroe, Jimmy Connors, Johan Kriek, Vitas Gerulaitis, Ilie Nastase, Sandy Mayer and Wojtek Fibak will make up the rest of the

field in the richest eight-man event in tennis history.

Borg, for his part, had mixed feelings about the stacked deck he faces, and suggested he might have more fun if the pressure were on somebody else.

"It's the first time for me," he said of the price on his head. "I wish it was the other way around."

McEnroe was sympathetic, but said his feelings would not stop him from going after the \$25,000. "Personally I think we've got enough incentive as it is, but now that it's there."

The actual odds against seeing Borg upset are long indeed. Against the seven other players he suffered only one loss last year — to McEnroe. He is 8-4 lifetime in matches against McEnroe, 13-8 against Connors.

However, Connors has talked very tough about regaining his No. 1

ranking this season and, so far, determination shows.

Borg needed all three sets to beat Connors at the Masters in New York last month. "That," said Borg, "is the best I have seen him in a long time."

The Toronto tournament, sponsored by a Canadian brewery, is rich in other incentives. Even players who lose every game guaranteed \$15,000 just for entering.

The winner receives \$175,000 but could increase that to \$225,000 if he cashes in on the other offers. There will be a \$15,000 bonus to the player who records the most service aces, \$10,000 to the player with the most 6-0 sets, and the \$25,000 bounty for the player who defeats the master of tennis, Borg.

The five-day tournament is Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens special event and does not affect rankings.

## Both big and small give all in victories

One of the biggest men in the Southwest Conference and one of the smallest had their finest moments as collegians Tuesday night and while they were enjoying themselves things were quite normal where Arkansas and Texas were concerned.

The visiting team seems to always do well when the Razorbacks and Longhorns get together and that's what happened again Tuesday night — Arkansas whipping Texas, 54-48, and moving into second place in the SWC chase behind the Houston Cougars.

Houston, behind 6-9 Larry Micheaux' early baskets and the 29 points of Rob Williams, smashed SMU, 79-64, while little Ronnie Blake — all 5'6 of him — made the key play of the game that allowed Baylor to score at the buzzer and beat the Rice Owls, 60-59.

And in Fort Worth, Texas Tech was forced into overtime by TCU, but the Raiders beat the Horned Frogs for the 19th straight time, 70-60.

All of that left Houston with an 8-2 record and Arkansas at 6-3. Rice and Baylor are both at 6-4.

"Anytime you beat Texas it is a great victory," said Arkansas coach Eddie Sutton. "Our fans put a premium on victories over Texas. They made a great run at us (cutting a 12-point deficit to three), but we held our poise."

Arkansas held Texas to a 20.7 percentage from the field in the first half and 36 percent for the game.

"We made a lot of mental errors," said Texas coach Abe Lemons, "and our shooting was terrible."

Houston scored the first 10 points of its meeting with Houston with Micheaux dominating play early and finishing with 19 points.
