RHA restructure discussion sole topic of meeting tonight

Battalion Staff The proposed restructuring of the Residence Hall Association will be the sole topic of discussion at a special RHA meeting tonight in 209 Harrington at 7:00.

At the last meeting, after an hour of discussion, the plan was voted down. "I don't think they were against it," RHA President Sherrie Balcar said. "I think they just wanted

Balcar said, is "to make the committees in RHA more effective. We have many new programs coming up this semester and the present structure is not effective at all.

The restructuring would change the number of members on the executive council from seven to four, dropping the chaplain, public relations director and the national communications coordinator. These three, Balcar said, are appointed

Also, the new plan would establish five departments covering certain areas as opposed to the existing 17 committees. This would provide for more consistency and effectiveness in the workings of the various programs, Balcar said

Balcar said the plan would also give general members a better opportunity to get involved. "And I think that's really important because there's a lot of young leadership out there," she said


