COOKIETOWN, Okla. — Farmers in southwestern Oklahoma and North Texas have summoned a California rainmaker to help them out of the drought that has plagued the area for months.

James Kinder, chairman of the group called Cotton County Services Inc., said a similar project carried out from 1972 to 1978 resulted in increased rainfall and better crops. He said the process does not affect the frequency of showers, but causes more rain to fall when storm clouds do form.

"We are sold on it in Cotton County because we've had six years of experience," Kinder said.
