

Some of the best volleyball players in the nation will overrun the gyms of Texas A&M Universitv Saturday

From 8 a.m. to 9 p.m., the sixth annual Texas A&M Valentine's Day Invitational Tournament, hosted by the Aggie men's team, will be held in G. Rollie White and several gyms in the new addition of Kyle Field.

The event will consist of 47 teams, and Aggie Coach Dave Schakel is excited.

"We have this tournament for the benefit of the players," he said Tuesday, "but we have it here at Texas A&M hopefully to enlighten the students as to the exciting aspects of volleyball and get them interested.

Schakel's Texas A&M squad has put together an impressive string of performances since last spring, winning a dual match against archrival Texas last year and winning the regional championships. The team is the defending champion of the Valentine's Day Invitation-al, but Schakel expects this year's road to the finals will be tougher.
