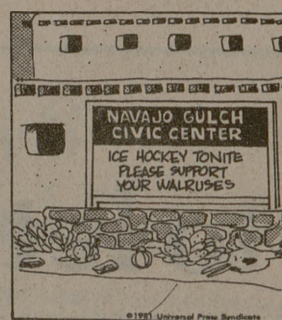

Volleyball team hosts Valentine Invitational

Some of the best volleyball players in the nation will overrun the gyms of Texas A&M University Saturday.

From 8 a.m. to 9 p.m., the sixth annual Texas A&M Valentine's Day Invitational Tournament, hosted by the Aggie men's team, will be held in G. Rollie White and several gyms in the new addition of Kyle Field.

The event will consist of 47 teams, and Aggie Coach Dave Schakel is excited.

"We have this tournament for the benefit of the players," he said Tuesday, "but we have it here at Texas A&M hopefully to enlighten the students as to the exciting aspects of volleyball and get them interested."

Schakel's Texas A&M squad has put together an impressive string of performances since last spring, winning a dual match against arch-rival Texas last year and winning the regional championships. The team is the defending champion of the Valentine's Day Invitational, but Schakel expects this year's road to the finals will be tougher.

"A&M won last year, and we had a good team," he said. "Everybody's back from last year's squad, except one player who went to play with UCLA a couple of years ago, but he's back with us this year."

John Kelly, the player returning, is joined by fellow center Les Templeton, middle blockers Schakel and Mark Piwonka and outside blockers Tim Friedlander and Foriboriz Estockri on the Aggie squad.

The tournament, which was a big hit last year at the University, will be bigger and better in '81 due to the addition of the new gyms on the east side of Kyle Field.

Last year's event consisted of 20 teams, 10 each in men's and women's classes. In 1981, however,

team, which consolidated last year with another strong squad fielded by the Dallas Volleyball Association. That merger will undoubtedly make the YMCA squad tougher.

"That puts together the best players in Dallas," said Schakel, "and they'll be much stronger than last year."

The Aggie women's volleyball team, which finished fourth in the state tournament last fall, will be competing in the AA division of the women's class. Two other women's teams representing Texas A&M will be competing in the A division.

Schakel stressed the women's competition will be exciting, with several name players competing.

Among those players is Tom Lutheran College's Patty Dowdy, who has served as captain of the women's U.S. Olympic volleyball team the past three years. The team was ranked much higher than the men's Olympic squad last summer, although the Moscow Olympics were boycotted by the United States.

The men's and women's final will be held at 8 p.m. Saturday in the main floor of G. Rollie White Coliseum. Admission price for the final matches will be \$1.50 at the door, or \$1 for advance tickets, which may be picked up at a table set up in the MSC. All other matches will be free. Proceeds from the finals will go to pay for the men's and women's tournament entry fees and gas money for transportation to and from the event during this semester.

There will be boards posted on the walls of the gyms giving the respective records of the teams in the tournament. The Texas A&M women will be playing on the fourth floor of Kyle, while the men will be competing on the third floor.

er, there will be more than twice that many, with 27 teams competing in the men's division and 20 in the women's.

Furthermore, the tournament will have a AA class, for professional caliber players, and an A class for other teams.

The AA tournament will have three pools competing in both the men's and women's divisions. In the A tournament, there will be three pools in the men's and only one in the women's. The top two teams from each pool will reach the quarterfinals of the tournament.

Schakel said that although Texas A&M will be fielding the strongest men's team its ever had, the competition will be rough. The main trouble will most likely come from the Dallas YMCA
