# Campus Names

Bruce R. Miles was named director of the Texas Forest Service at the Feb. 6 meeting of the Texas A&M University System Board of Regents.

Miles, 45, has served as TFS associate director since 1974 and was named acting director last October when Paul R. Kramer retired.

The regents also passed a formal resolution at their meeting commending Kramer for his 32 years of TFS service, including the last 13 as director.

Miles was recommended to head the state forestry agency by Dr. Frank W.R. Hubert, Texas A&M's chancellor, and Dr. Perry L. Adkisson, deputy chancellor for agriculture.

"He is recognized as a forester of the first class and an excellent administrator," Adkisson told the regents.

Miles joined the Texas Forest Service as an assistant forester in 1959 and rose through the ranks. In 1967 he was named assistant to the director, the position he held at the time he was promoted to associate director.

A former Houston resident,

Miles conducted his pre-forestry studies at Texas A&M University before going to Louisiana State University, where he received his forestry degree in 1958. He has since studied on the graduate level at Texas A&M, where he also serves as a lecturer in the Department of Forest Science.

Miles is a member of the Society of American Foresters and served as president of the Texas SAF chapter in 1975.

Dr. Charles M. Hix was named by the Board of Regents as dean of the College of Architecture and Environmental Design at Texas A&M University.

The recommendation to appoint Hix, who has served as interim dean since June 1980, was made partly in response to spontaneous support from faculty and students in the college to his interim service, said Texas A&M Acting President Charles Samson.

"At the time of the (interim)

appointment it was our intention to initiate a full-scale nationwide search for a new dean in which Dr. Hix would be eligible for consideration," Samson said. "During this time three department heads in the college have come forward voluntarily expressing strong support for Dr. Hix's appointment and urging that we proceed as rapidly as possible to take advantage of the momentum that the college has gained under his leadership."

Samson also referred to a letter written by a student to Vice President for Academic Affairs Dr. J.M. Prescott praising Hix for his "ability to unite different departments of the college in a homogeneous group."

Hix, 54, earned bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees all in civil engineering from Texas A&M. He was president and chief engineer of his own consulting engineering firm before joining the faculty in 1968.

Dr. Charles Pinnell has

been named associate deputy chancellor for engineering by the Texas A&M University System.

The appointment was approved by the board of regents in its regular meeting Feb. 6.

Pinnell, 51, moves up from assistant director of the Texas Transportation Institute, succeeding Heston Cherry who is retiring from the post.

Pinnell came to Texas A&M in 1958 as an assistant professor of civil engineering after having served as a field engineer with the Texas Highway Department and the Tubbs Engineering firm of Lubbock.

He holds a bachelor's degree in civil engineering from Texas Tech University; a master's degree, also in civil engineering, from Purdue University; and a Ph.D. from Texas A&M.

Since coming to Texas A&M Pinnell has served as professor of civil engineering, associate dean of academic affairs, assistant to the president for planning and analytical studies and his recent position with the Texas Transportation Institute.

# Sea sickness ends tugboat hijack

PORT ARTHUR — A pair of modern day pirates, armed with a shotgun and a knife, forced a tugboat out to sea, but were foiled by an old landlubber's nemesis — sea sickness.

The men forced a four-man tugboat crew to head their 92-foot vessel out to sea Sunday, but quit the attempt when running into heavy seas, authorities said.

Arrested by Port Arthur police

and charged with aggravated robbery and kidnapping were Alan Cook, 38, no address given, and Delmus Hamilton, 43, of Canton, Texas. Police said no motive for the hijacking had been determined.

"There were no injuries, except for some sea sickness," said Coast Guard spokesman Robert Quaker in Sabine Pass.

Quaker said Cook and Hamilton boarded the tugboat "E.M.

Black" around 1:30 a.m. Sunday while it was docked in an industrial area on the Sabine-Neches Waterway.

The captain and his three-member crew were ordered to take the boat to sea, Quaker said. They gave the crew no reason for wanting to head into the Gulf of Mexico.

About 40 miles off the Texas coast, the tugboat, owned by Moran Towing Co. of Port Arthur,

ran into rough water and began taking on water in the 6-15 ft swells.

Quaker said the two men rendered to the captain, who he called the coast guard for assistance around 10:15 a.m.

Port Arthur police joined coast guard officers on a cutter and on the boat as it entered the channel near Sabine Pass. Hamilton and Cook were arrested around 2:15 p.m.

# Offshore oilspill crews dispatched

NEW ORLEANS — Special cleanup crews were dispatched Monday to a fire-damaged oilfield production platform in the Gulf of Mexico to prevent any damaging spills.

The blaze Sunday sent 13 workers scrambling down ropes and ladders to safety and spread an oil slick, about a third of a mile wide and half a mile long, across the water near the platform. The slick was not considered significant, a

company official said.

"We have mobilized two quick-response units to stand by in case they are needed," said spokesman Al Spindler of Ocean Drilling and Exploration. "They have all the necessary equipment to contain and remove any oil that may seep out."

Spindler said the crews came from Clear Gulf, a cooperative of companies working in the Gulf of Mexico.

Investigators from the drilling company were at the scene, he said, but would not board the platform until derricks had straightened it safely from a 45-degree list.

"We have a crew out there, but until the derrick barges get there and get the thing stabilized, they won't be able to go aboard and see what happened," he said.

Rescue boats carried the platform workers to safety. Workboats sprayed water on the flames for about eight hours before extinguishing them.

The platform was the ODECO Platform S.O.B. in Ship Sho Block 113, 50 miles south of the Louisiana coast. The platform is operated by the Ocean Production Co., a subsidiary of ODECO.

Spindler said the fire would cause environmental pollution, he said. "The automatic safety valve system shut in all the wells that were feeding the platform. ## Dog food is part of survival kit

LOS ANGELES — A Southern California survival company that features mail order products to help humans stay alive during catastrophes is now offering dehydrated food for dogs.

Gene Tarman, president of Country Roads Inc. and producer of "Sir Vival," says people will abandon their pets, no matter what happens.

"Actually, I'm not of the belief that something like that (a disaster) is going to happen," Tarman said. "But I view it as an insurance policy, and the dog food falls under the same heading."

Tarman said the wheat-meat-based dog food is dried before it is canned. The oxygen is removed and the can is filled with nitrogen. An 18-ounce bucket of the "Sir Vival" dog food sells for \$14.25 and has a shelf-life of five to seven years.
