Miles, 45, has served as TFS associate director since 1974 and was named acting director last October when Paul R. Kramer retired. The regents also passed a for-

mal resolution at their meeting commending Kramer for his 32 years of TFS service, including the last 13 as director.

Miles was recommended to head the state forestry agency by Dr. Frank W.R. Hubert, Texas A&M's chancellor, and Dr. Perry L. Adkisson, deputy chancellor for agriculture. 'He is recognized as a fores-

ter of the first class and an excellent administrator," Adkisson told the regents. Miles joined the Texas

Forest Service as an assistant forester in 1959 and rose through the ranks. In 1967 he was named assistant to the director, the position he held at the time he was promoted to associate director.

A former Houston resident,

Miles conducted his pre-forestry studies at Texas A&M University before going to Louisiana State University, where he received his forestry degree in 1958. He has since studied on the graduate level at Texas A&M, where he also serves as a lecturer in the Department of Forest Science.

Miles is a member of the Society of American Foresters and served as president of the Texas SAF chapter in 1975.


