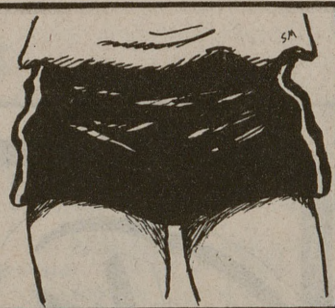


Jock Shorts



Men's basketball

Aggie head coach Shelby Metcalf, with the win over Rice last Saturday, is now tied with SMU's Doc Hayes on the SWC career win list with 163 victories.

Metcalf's SWC record is now 163-90 in 18 years. He trails Arkansas' Glen Rose (176 wins in 23 years). Metcalf's overall career record is 285-188.

Coach Bill Nix will take a nine-woman squad to Baton Rouge, La., for the LSU Women's Invitational Indoor Track and Field meet Friday and Saturday.

A field of 16 teams is slated to compete in the two-day meet.

Football

Spring football drills at Texas A&M will begin Tuesday, March 3, and will end with the Maroon-White game at 7:30 p.m., Saturday, April 11.

The Aggies will work two weeks prior to the spring break and will have three weeks after the break.

Spring training is limited to 20 days over 36 calendar days. Next fall, the Ags will open play at California-Berkely Sept. 5, then have an off-week before going to Boston College Sept. 19.

The final non-conference game will be at Kyle Field against Louisiana Tech Sept. 26.

Men's track

With three of last year's champions on the squad, Texas A&M will attempt to successfully defend its team title Friday in the Southwest Conference Indoor Track and Field Championships at the Tarrant County Convention Center in Fort Worth.

The three Ags who will be defending their individual titles are Don Jones in the high jump, Randy Hall in the pole vault and Mike Glaspie in the 60-yard high hurdles.

Too, the Aggies were weakened somewhat when sprinter Floyd Furlow pulled a hamstring muscle in the Oklahoma Indoor Classic in Oklahoma City Feb. 7. He is entered in the 60-yard dash but will not likely be at full speed.

The Texas A&M University men's golf team finished fourth among 16 teams at the Lamar Intercollegiate Golf Tournament at the Pinewood Country Club in Sourlake Wednesday.

The Ags stroked a team total of 900, 38 strokes behind the streaking University of Houston's 862. Oklahoma State and the University of Texas were the second and third place teams with scores of 879 and 890 respectively.

Behind A&M were host Lamar with a 903, Centenary 907, North Texas State 910, TCU 914 and Rice at 921 to round out the top ten.

Ag totals are: Brad Jones 219, Richard Cromwell 222, Jay Townsend 227, Mark Esler 232 and Danny Briggs 235.

The Ags' next competition will be the Border Olympic Golf Tournament Feb. 27-28 in Laredo.

Ladies' soccer team in action

The Texas A&M women's soccer team, led by All-American Adele Fairman, will challenge the nationally-ranked "Sting" from Dallas Saturday at 2 p.m. on Cain Field.

The Dallas "Sting" is recognized as being one of the strongest women's soccer teams in the country. The team is comprised of girls 19 and under.

The A&M women's team is ranked fifth nationally and first in the state.

The Aggies began their spring schedule Feb. 14, beating Southwest Texas State University with a score of 7-1 in San Marcos.

Coach Steve Niles said that the Aggies played a good game, controlling the ball with a lot of teamwork and an outstanding amount of individual skill.

A&M used its offense effectively and scored two goals within the first 20 minutes.

Carol Smith played an outstanding game, scoring 2 goals, directly assisting at least one other goal and setting up the plays.

Other top scorers were Carol Sullivan and Sue Tesar, each with 2 goals, with Lynn Vester contributing one goal.

The Aggies were led defensively by Adele Fairman, Melanie Felger and Bonnie Zigmond.

The women have no set schedule as of yet, but are in the process of setting up games for the semester. Under new coach Niles, the Aggies expect to improve on the team's performance of a semester ago.

Last semester Adele Fairman was named to the first all-American team in the national finals in Colorado for her outstanding

play. "I didn't really deserve it. A couple of others on the team played real well. In the first game I played well. The second game was o.k. Coach (Rob) Borgeson was supposed to nominate someone

from the team and he thought I would have a better chance than the others," Fairman said.

The team finished the semester winning one of two games good enough for fifth place.

Aggies end third in HBU tourney

The Texas A&M University women's golf team finished last weekend's Houston Baptist Invitational in third place. The women were sitting in first place going into the final round, but a strong showing by TCU and University of Tulsa upended the 10th-ranked Aggies.

TCU won the tournament with a three-day total of 906. Tulsa was second with 914. A&M finished with 916. The University of Texas shot 920 for fourth place.

Kim Bauer lead the Aggies with a three-round total of 224. In the first round Bauer shot a course record 71. She finished in second place individually, shooting 75 and 78 in the final two rounds. Other Aggie scores were: Susan Yantis (sixth), 74-75-79-228; Shirley Furlong (14th), 77-78-76-231; Monica Welsh (20th), 76-79-79-234; Jackie Bertram (27th), 78-78-80-236.

The women will return to action March 1-3 when they will host the Texas A&M Invitational Tournament at Briarcrest Country Club in Bryan.
