Medfly fumigation orders criticized

United Press International SACRAMENTO, Calif. — The state's agriculture chief has promised "legal action if necessary" to overturn Texas' order that California fruit imports be fumigated because of infestations of the Mediterranean fruit fly.

"Texas' requirement that all California fruits and vegetables, even those not in the quarantine area, be treated is completely unnecessary," Food and Agriculture Director Richard Rominger said Wednesday in a statement.

"The only area in California under state and federal quarantine because of the medfly is in Santa Clara County and a small part of Alameda County," Rominger said. "This amounts to about 500 square miles, and all commercial shipments from there are treated before they leave the area."

Rominger said the state could go to federal court over the issue. "We will do whatever we can to get the Texas order rescinded," he said, "including taking legal action if necessary."

Texas imports about \$100 million worth of California fruits and vegetables each year and the cost of treating the produce for growers would be in excess of \$1 million, department officials estimated.

On Tuesday, Texas Agriculture Commissioner Reagan Brown announced that fumigation of California produce would begin March 1. He also noted that California requires fumigation of Texas shipments going into California because of the Mexican fruit fly.

In response, Assemblyman John Thurman, chairman of the Assembly Agriculture Committee, said of Texas' action: "This is nothing but a retaliatory thing on California growers because the federal Department of Agriculture has them quarantined in the lower Rio Grande Valley."

"Fumigation would have to be done in California and would have to have a certificate on it. The Mediterranean fruit fly has never been found anywhere in California but in a small part of the Santa Clara Valley."

Thurman, D-Modesto, noted that Florida agriculture officials apparently have dropped plans to ban imports of California fruit after inspecting the eradication program in the valley.

"When the Florida people came out here a few weeks ago they were very impressed with our dedication effort," he said. "This gave us a clean bill of health."

Man sleeps on Louisiana railroad line

United Press International ALEXANDRIA, La. — Railroad tracks, as Charles Lipssett probably would tell you, are not the best place to go to sleep.

Lipssett apparently was oblivious to that thought Wednesday — because he put his pillow down on some Missouri-Pacific tracks and went to sleep, Rapides Parish sheriff's deputies said.

The deputies said he apparently never noticed the train that roared over him.

Lipssett, of Bossier City, La. was found alongside the tracks Louisiana 1 after a train crew spotted his pillow and stopped the train. Lipssett was taken to a local hospital suffering from minor cuts and bruises.

"He was asleep on the track and he had a pillow under his head," said a sheriff's spokeswoman. "The train that had gone by previously, it definitely hit the pillow and apparently knocked him into a ditch."

The spokeswoman said Lipssett spoke to a deputy and was conscious when found.

As for his unlikely choice of place to sleep, she said, "You'd be surprised. It's the second time in about the last three or four months (in Rapides Parish) this has happened."
