SACRAMENTO, Calif. — The go to federal court over the issue. state's agriculture chief has promised "legal action if necessary" to overturn Texas' order that California fruit imports be fumigated because of infestations of the Mediterranean fruit fly.

'Texas' requirement that all California fruits and vegetables, even those not in the quarantine area, be treated is completely unnecessary," Food and Agriculture Director Richard Rominger said Wednesday in a statement.

'The only area in California under state and federal quarantine because of the medfly is in Santa Clara County and a small part of Alameda County," Rominger said. "This amounts to about 500 square miles, and all commercial shipments from there are treated before they leave the area.
