Demo chief criticize Clements

AUSTIN — The Texas Democratic Executive Committee will plan for regional primary elections on different days in a scheme to reduce the number of Democratic votes.

A Saturday meeting of Democratic party leaders passed a resolution opposing Gov. William Clements' idea of a regional "day" primary.

The Democrats strongly criticized Clements' proposal to hold the presidential and regular primaries on separate days in Texas and several other western states.

Democrats contend a split primary would draw away Democratic votes. The primary would be set aside a day in March for a regional primary and a full week in May for regular party primaries.

The 66-member committee also unanimously adopted a resolution charging the governor with misuse of the nomination process.

Sue Cox of Dallas, chairman of a watchdog subcommittee, said a member of the governor's office promised to reappoint the band of a prominent Democratic party member if she would leave her position and pledge to be re-elected for several years.

In other action, the committee unanimously endorsed a proposal to draft and send a resolution to the Legislature for a constitutional amendment to elect the senators of state.

Texas AFL-CIO President Harry Hubbard gave the address to the group Saturday and urged its members to use methods to reduce Democratic candidate in-fighting.
