# Tennis squad beats Peay

Trying to recover from a 9-0 loss to Trinity, the men's tennis team defeated Austin Peay University of Clarksville, Tenn., 7-2 Tuesday.

The Ags swept the first four singles but were in danger of losing the momentum when Don Carbone of Peay won the fifth singles over Ron Kowal 6-3, 7-6.

Hartmut Junghahn of Austin Peay won the first set of the sixth singles to give Peay a decided advantage in momentum. But freshman Leonard Smith killed the short-lived rally by defeating Junghahn 5-7, 6-2, 7-5 in a tough, exciting match.

"It was Leonard's best win ever," said Aggie coach David Kent. The crowd got behind Smith after the first set and supported him through the rest of the games of the final two sets.

Kent, although complimenting Smith, was not happy with the overall team performance.

"I am not pleased with our play," said Kent. "We were flat today and I don't know why." He said the team had its bright spots but overall, the play was just not as sharp as it had been.

Senior Reid Freeman said he was not pleased with his play despite winning the number one singles 6-4, 6-4 over Hal Jolley.

"I was missing too many shots," he said. "But they have a good team."

In singles: Freeman beat Jolley; Brian Joelson defeated Greg Car-

ter 6-3, 4-6, 6-1; Trey Schutz beat Kurt Williamson 6-1, 6-4; Tom Judson defeated Paul Caff 6-2, 6-3; Kowal lost to Carbone and Smith beat Junghahn.

Doubles results were: Kowal-Judson lost to Jolley-Carter 6-4, 6-3; Joelson-Freeman beat Williamson-Caff 6-3, 7-5 and Schutz-Max King defeated Junghahn-Brad Properjohn 6-2, 6-4.

The Ags begin the Southwest Conference season Saturday against Baylor at the Omar Smith Tennis Center at 1:30 p.m. The

team will have a warm-up match on Friday at the Smith center at 1:30 also.

# Too Tall now into music

DALLAS — Ed "Too Tall" Jones, the Dallas Cowboys defensive end and erstwhile heavyweight boxer, has launched a singing career.

Jones' single, "Do the Dip" backed with "Funkin' on the Radio," was played at his debut at a country-western nightclub Monday. The songs, which will be part of an album, are disco style but Jones said his interest runs more toward rhythm and blues.

"Disco isn't my kind of music," he said. "The two songs in this single will be the only disco numbers in the album. It will be basically a rhythm and blues thing."

Jones, who skipped the Cowboys' 1979 season try boxing, said he recorded the single in October and recently released it on the Fun City label, which he operates with his brother, Cliff Jones. He said it was something he had wanted to do for "about eight years, really. I was just waiting for the right time."

The Joneses operate TTC Booking Agency in Memphis, Tenn., and Jones said he had heard similar efforts by several other singers.

"I think I'm in the ballpark," he said.

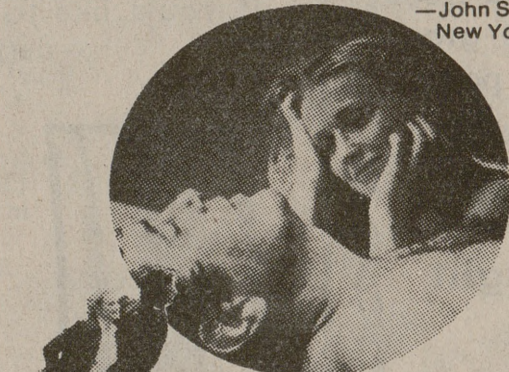
