Search for survivors of shipwreck ends

JUNEAU, Alaska — A sinking, fire-ravaged South Korean freighter was under tow today and the Coast Guard abandoned all hope for the survival of 23 missing crewmen who jumped into the frigid North Pacific.

Only three of the 26 crew members aboard the Dae Rim, which caught fire last Friday, were rescued and one of those men later died. The Coast Guard, saying there was no hope that the missing crewmen could have survived in the chilly waters 90 miles west of the Aleutian island chain, ended its search late Sunday.

The decision came after Russian sailors from a salvage ship, the Predanny, boarded the badly listing Dae Rim to look for three South Korean sailors not seen leaving the freighter. The Russian sailors found no bodies or survivors.

The Predanny reported it had the Dae Rim under tow, but its destination was not immediately known, the Coast Guard said. At last report, the vessel was still afloat and listing 60 degrees, with its main decks awash.

A helicopter dispatched from the Coast Guard cutter Morganthau was on its way to Attu for a rendezvous with the Russian vessels.

From there, the two survivors, who were reported in good condition, and the lone body were to be flown to a military air base on the island of Shemya, where C-130s were standing by fly them to Kodiak. The search effort was continued through Sunday although Coast Guard spokesmen doubted any of the crewmen would be found alive after a rubber raft was dropped on the ship late Saturday and "no one went for it." Survival time in the 37degree water is only about 90 minutes.

The Dae Rim transmitted a "mayday" radio message late Friday saying it had been afire for three hours. A later message said the fire had reached the ship's fuel tanks and was out of control, prompting the skipper to make an urgent plea for assistance.

Volunteers find no new clues in Atlanta slayings

ATLANTA — An estimated 500 volunteer searchers turned out Saturday to look for clues in the slayings and disappearances of 21 Atlanta black children, but came away empty handed.

There was a flurry of excitement when one of the seven search groups found some bones along an expressway ramp, but it was later determined they were the remains of a large dog.

Atlanta City Councilman Arthur Langford, organizer of the volunteer searches, denied a report that the names of volunteer searchers were being turned over to police on the theory the child killer may be participating in the search effort.

But Langford said the possibility the killer may be posing as one of the searchers could not be discounted. "That's a real possibility," he said. "We can't take anything for granted."

Some additional bones were found at three other locations, but Medical Examiner Joe Burton said these also were animal bones.

Of the 21 children who have disappeared during the past year and a half, 19 have been found slain and the other two are officially listed as missing.

The Saturday search was the 20th such weekend effort. Spring-like weather and mounting concern over the baffling string of

crimes brought volunteers out in increased numbers this weekend.

Discovery of the bones along the interstate ramp caused a traffic jam on the super highway as squad cars rushed to the scene and curious motorists stopped to see what was going on.

First reports were that some skeletal remains, clothes and a sleeping bag had been found. The area was immediately marked off with yellow crime scene tape and everyone was ordered out of the area.

But later, Cobb County Police Chief W. J. Reid said, "It's just the skeleton of a large dog. Evidently it got hit on the interstate and crawled into the woods to die." What at first looked like a sleeping bag actually was a pile of rags.

The search Saturday was concentrated in a border area that included parts of Fulton (Atlanta) and neighboring Cobb County. This was the same general vicinity where one of the missing children, Curtis Walker, 13, vanished Feb. 19. The body of another victim, Patrick Walker, 16, also was found in the area last December.

Spokesman criticizes judges' busing plans

PINEVILLE, La. — Federal judges have gone berserk with forced busing and are wrecking public schools in the United States, the president of the National Association for Neighborhood Schools said.

William D'Onofrio told a group of Rapides Parish residents this weekend that forced busing will never be stopped if people continue to believe "it won't touch them."

D'Onofrio said a busing plan has destroyed the schools in the New Orleans area and is wrecking lives. He said desegregation forces now realize that busing plans must cover wide areas of work.

"Pro-busers realize a city school plan won't work because of white flight. They are going to metropolitan area plans," he said.

D'Onofrio urged citizens to get involved, become better educated about busing issues and pressure congressmen to sponsor and support anti-busing legislation.

Rapides Parish was the site of a major anti-busing controversy last year following an order by U.S. District Judge Nauman Scott resigning about 3,100 of the district's 27,000 students.

Islanders upset over monkeys

TAVERNIER, Fla. — For Dolores Blackwell, 82, it's just an upheaval after another these days — if it isn't refugees, it's monkeys.

Blackwell, who has lived on Plantation Key for 50 years, is one of many residents upset at the idea they may soon be downwind from a monkey farm.

They are outraged at Melvin Laney, who wants to put 10,000 monkeys in cages on uninhabited Fernandez Key and sell them to medical researchers — willing to pay up to \$2,000 apiece since he stopped exporting Rhesus monkeys in 1979.

"That island is so close you can hear people talking on it at night," said Blackwell, who lives a mile from the 167-acre mangrove island. "Can you imagine 10 monkey females in the same cage with one male?"

"And you know the flies and mosquitoes are going to be in there all over the place. And when the rain blows in, it's going to wash all that smelly monkey mess right into the water," she said.
