

Williams leads UPI picks

SAN ANTONIO — Five underclassmen, headed by league scoring leader Rob Williams, were named Thursday to the United Press International all-Southwest Conference basketball team, the first time since UPI began selecting a team in the mid 1950s that no senior made the squad.

Williams, the sixth leading scorer in nation, was the only unanimous player named to the all-SWC team selected by a select panel of sports writers and sports broadcasters who cover conference games.

Vernon Smith of Texas A&M was selected for the second team,

the lone member for the defending SWC champions.

Eddie Sutton, whose Arkansas Razorbacks won their fourth league title in five years and who will take an 11-game winning streak into the league's post-season tournament, was named coach of the year.

Williams was also voted player of the year in the conference and Clyde Drexler, Houston's 6-6 freshman who was named to the second team and who was second in rebounding this season, was selected newcomer of the year.

Joining Williams on the first team were juniors Terry Teagle of Baylor, Scott Hastings of Arkansas

and Ricky Pierce of Rice.

The second team was made up of Drexler, Smith of Texas A&M, U.S. Reed of Arkansas, Darrell Browder of TCU and Clarence Swannegan of Texas Tech. Smith and Reed were the only seniors among the top ten players in the

voting.

Williams, whose quick moves and long-range jump shots propelled Houston in front of the conference race before a late-season slump cost them a chance at the title, scored 674 points during the regular season.

Texas A&M loses to Clemson, 6-3

With nothing to lose and everything to gain, the Texas A&M tennis team played its heart out against sixth-rated Clemson University Thursday.

It was their second match in the H.E.B. College Team Championships in Corpus Christi. The Aggies are in action today also.

The Ags did not win the match but played very well, taking Clemson to the wire. The 6-3 loss did not hurt the Ags much and even could help their confidence.

"I was very pleased with our performance today," said coach David Kent. "We played our hearts out and I can't ask for anything more."

The Ags had a very tough but well played match. Brian Joelson's and Max King's singles matches were the highlights for the Ags. Both won three set singles matches against strong opposition.

"Brian played an absolutely fabulous three set match," said Kent. Joelson has had the flu but is over the effects now, he said.

In singles: Trey Schutz lost to Mark Dickson 4-6, 4-6; Reid Freeman lost to Pender Murphy 6-6,

1-6; Joelson beat Gean Desduens 5-7, 7-5, 6-2; Tom Judson lost to Richard Akel 7-6, 6-4; King defeated Rick Rudeen 6-7, 6-3, 7-6 and Ron Kowal lost to Greg Cooper 6-4, 1-6, 4-6.

Doubles results were: Freeman-Joelson lost to Dickson-Murphy 4-6, 6-3, 5-7; Judson-Kowal beat Akel-Rudeen 4-6, 6-2, 6-3 and Schutz-King lost to Cooper-Desduens 4-6, 6-7.

The loss lowers the Ags record to 10-2 for the year but Kent said he will take the loss as it stands.

"Clemson beat Trinity earlier in the year. We played them to a standstill," Kent said. "So maybe we're improving."

Trinity is the Ags only other loss. A&M was skunked by Trinity 9-0 in an early season dual match.

The 20th-ranked Ags next action will be today at 8:30 a.m. against the University of San Diego. San Diego is going into the match as the 19th-ranked team in the nation.

Kent said it should prove to be an interesting match because both teams are fairly even in ability, ranking, desire and record.
