A&M accepts wills for body donations

Although few people know it, the Texas A&M College of Medicine anatomy department accepts wills from persons wishing to donate their bodies for research after they die.

The department receives about two or three wills a month, but it has tried to minimize publicity of the program because there is only limited space to store willed bodies, Dr. Jackson W. Wagner, the department head, said.

Minimum publicity and limited storage space has created somewhat of a dilemma, however.

The College of Medicine needs at least 10 bodies a year, Wagner said, and only four bodies have been received as a result of wills in the past two years, he said. Baylor College of Medicine supplies the difference.

"Our situation is not unique at all," Wagner said. "It's part of the growing pains... of a new school that really still doesn't have its own physical facility in operation."

Storage space for 100 bodies will become available when the new Medical Sciences Building is finished, Wagner said.

Until the building is finished, however, willed bodies are being stored at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston and shipped to the anatomy department in College Station as they are needed.

Baylor College of Medicine has been storing willed bodies for the department since the program began three years ago, Wagner said.

Most of these bodies are used for dissection by first-year medical students. After the students are finished, the bodies are cremated at the Brookside Crematory in Houston. Ashes are then interred or returned to relatives.
