Med school wants grant for minorities

The Texas A&M University
College of Medicine has requested a \$138,000 grant from the
Department of Health and Human Services for orientation of
financially and educationally disadvantaged students.

The application for the grant proposes a three-year health careers opportunity program beginning in winter 1982 involving actual classroom and laboratory experiences for disadvantaged medical school applicants.

The program will involve about 45 people, 15 each year for a three-year period.

Students will attend classes, work in research laboratories and attend seminars which describe medicine and medical practices.

"This will give the applicants the opportunity to interface with our current students," said Dr. William E. Ward, Texas A&M associate dean of medicine in charge of student affairs.

Ward said the goals of the proposal are to identify students from disadvantaged backgrounds seeking education leading to a medical degree and also to orient students in application to medical school.


