Any state redistricting plan may bring litigation

United Press International AUSTIN — Any redistricting plan approved by the Legislature will undoubtedly face court challenges, and lawmakers' conversations with staff members or lobbyists could be used as evidence, a legal expert told state senators.

Steve Bickerstaff, retained by the Legislature since 1979 to study legal ramifications of redis-tricting, advised lawmakers on possible legal action Tuesday.

There is no area of legislative activity where the legal problems are more complex or that is more fraught with error," he said. "It is a virtual certainty that whatever action the Legislature takes will be litigated."

The Senate met for the first time Tuesday as a committee of the whole to discuss redistricting. The Senate also heard a report on preparations by the Legislative Council to handle redistricting bills.

Bickerstaff told the Senate areas of inte could be considered, but population is the prim ary criteria in drafting new districts.

"The bottom line is who will draw the dist whether they will be drawn by you (the Sena whether they will be drawn by the fed courts," he said. "What is most important to member is that population must be the con ing criteria.

Bickerstaff said the courts will apply a stride standard for congressional districts than for star legislative districts.


