Wants to insure that no more students are forced off campus, and wants to see student recreation facilities expanded, currently president of the Young Democrats.

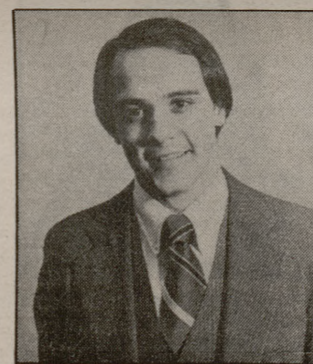
**Junior Liberal Arts Senator**

Plans to take polls on issues to get constituency's ideas. Will support services that are beneficial to students. Wants to help people she would represent.

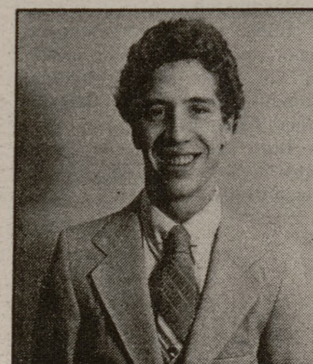
**At-Large Science Senator**

Says he will be a responsible representative of ideas of science students, has experience with Student Government and External Affairs Committee.



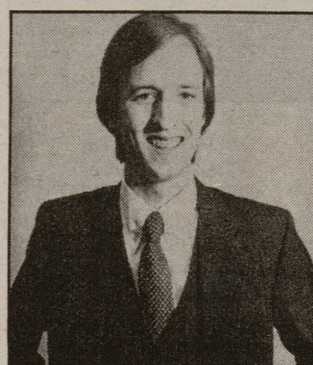
**KEN JOHNSON**

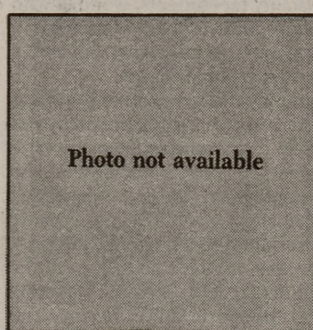
**MARC SCHNEIDER**

Johnson says he will also work for the continuation of finals exemption for seniors. A third problem Johnson says he will attempt to solve concerns the teaching effectiveness of the faculty. "Effective teaching must not be sacrificed for the sake of research," he says.

Schneider says he also feels it is important to enhance tradition and students services in order to keep pace with the rapid growth at Texas A&M. To keep tradition at Texas

Collins, who is the current vice president of external affairs, says communication between students and the senate is the major weakness of the Student Government. He plans to solve this problem by encouraging more contact between senators and students and

Woodruff, a junior psychology major from Houston, says his qualifications are dedication, experience, a serious attitude and a commitment to be informed on all matters. "While acting as president of APO, chairman of the Aggie Blood Drive and serving in other positions, I have developed

Johnson says there is a need for better contact between senators and their constituents. "We should make constituent contact a factor in the existing point system used to monitor senators' effectiveness," he says. Johnson says one of the primary weaknesses in the Student Government is that too many senators drop out. "We need strong competition for all senate positions," Johnson says. This measure should bring greater awareness of Student Government.

He would assure student approval of housing policies by forming a committee to monitor administrative activity and keeping students informed, he says. Schneider is a second-year senator and has served on the External Affairs Committee, Student Services Committee and Academic Affairs Committee, as well as RHA.

Collins says his qualifications are one year as vice president of external affairs, one year as a student senator, one year as the director of business and consumer relations and one year as a representative of the Off-Campus Student Association.

Woodruff says his goal as student body president is researching student opinion and representing it in the fairest way possible. Key problems Herring sees facing the University are "problems with academic requirements — one sometimes questions if students are getting a 'University education.' Through improving advisor-student relations, a student's goal can be better defined and met."
