"This latest attempt on the life of a president of the U.S. is not only shocking, but also evidence that brutal, senseless violence continues to be an aspect of American life and that all sorts of unstable people have easy access to handguns," United Auto Workers union President Douglas A. 'This tragedy reminds us that violence and the easy availability of firearms make every citizen of high or low station vulnerable to a murderous gun," he said.

Hinckley was being held for mental examination, FBI Director William Webster said, but safety considerations clouded where the examination would take place.

"People are saying, Do you want another Jack Ruby situation?" one source said, referring

to Ruby's killing of suspect Lee Harvey Oswald following the assassination of John F. Kennedy.

Although Hinckley's court-appointed lawyers asked a federal magistrate to restrict the Secret Service and FBI from interrogating him until he underwent psychiatric examination, no order had been signed by noon Tuesday.

It could not be learned whether investigators are continuing to question Hinckley about the motive for the shooting, or the pos-

siblity of a conspiracy.
