### Boys stuff envelopes to see shuttle launch but miss it

SPACE CENTER, HOUSTON — Three boys who planned to stuff envelopes to recoup a \$200 airfare from Colorado to Johnson Space Center for the space shuttle launch were denied admission Sunday and missed it.

Instead of watching the launch on big-screen television in the Building 2 auditorium, they ended up seeing it on a 5-foot-5-inch battery-powered television in a friend's car parked at a gas station.

"We're obviously disappointed," Kerwin Brook said.

Brook, 14, Monty Moss, 14, and Sean Ingram, 15, flew to Houston Thursday to stay with relatives and get as close to the action as they could. They had no relatives at Cape Canaveral, Fla., and the airfare was higher.

The three are advanced mathematics students at Northeast Junior High School in Northglenn, Colo., a Denver suburb. They expected

to recoup the cost by stuffing envelopes for a mail order house, \$100 for each 1,000 stuffed.

The boys planned to write a story for the Northglenn Sentinel and make reports to several of their classes.

The boys were admitted to JSC Friday and watched on the big screen television in Building 2 auditorium when the launch was postponed until Sunday. The boys went to stay with relatives, and expected no problem returning Sunday.

They were mistaken. When they arrived at the gate, a different guard was on duty and stopped them and said they were members of the public and could not be admitted until 9 a.m.

"We gave it up and went down to a gas station," Brook said. "We pulled in there and watched the rest of it on my portable TV. We couldn't make it back to town. It's not very pleasing to me."

The boys said they were back to Denver late Sunday, disappointed.

JSC spokesman Dave Alter letting the boys in Friday had a mistake. He said the public not supposed to be admitted the regular 9 a.m. opening.

"I don't know how they got here Friday," Alter said. "You are in mission status, mission status requires some discipline. You have to show a badge, you come through the gate and some identification."

The boys had applied for credentials as representatives of the Northglenn Sentinel. Credentials had been denied because the boys were under 18.

Brook said the experience color his report.

### A&M ship to lead search for remains of the Titanic

DALLAS — Abilene millionaire Jack Grimm said Sunday he is confident his crews will find and photograph the remains of the Titanic this summer and discover why the ill-fated vessel sank.

"The second stage of our expedition is pretty much on schedule," said Grimm Sunday at the Dallas-Fort Worth Regional Airport where he stopped on his way home from New York City.

The research ship Gyre was commissioned by Grimm from Texas A&M University last summer when he no longer could contain "the irresistible appeal the Titanic has always had for me."

The expedition, the first stage of which was completed last summer when sonar signals led Grimm to believe the Titanic had been found, will take the poker-playing oilman, and a crack team of 36 oceanographers to the site off the Grand Banks of Newfoundland.

"The party will proceed from Halifax, Nova Scotia, on July 2 or 3 aboard the Gyre and will take about 2 1/2 days to reach the site," Grimm said. "The expedition then on should last about three weeks."

The Titanic, on its maiden voyage from England, encountered a gigantic iceberg the night of April 14, 1912, and went down the next day taking with it 1,503 of the more than 2,200 passengers on board. The ship's remains are believed to be 12,500 feet

below the surface.

The need to discover the liner and whatever it was carrying has only grown with the years as Grimm is among those who have ventured to risk millions in the effort to find the ship.

"We wouldn't be doing this unless we are confident of our success," he said.

It is that confidence that inspired Grimm to pay up most of the \$1.25 million the expedition cost in its first phase. Grimm says the second phase should be "a little less."

What does he hope to get in return if the expedition does succeed?

"The artifacts from the Titanic should pay for the cost," the oilman said. "But that's not the idea. People from all over the world have been wanting to know what really happened to the Titanic and hope to provide the answer."

The number of sonar signals Grimm's group received from the site last summer raises Grimm hopes about the success of the expedition.

"There were some 14 signals in all and our subsequent research have shown three of them to be prime prospects," Grimm said. Those signals, he thinks, are from the Titanic because they came four or five miles from where the SOS was received.

### Clements says share PUF

AUSTIN — Gov. Bill Clements said he favors sharing the wealth of the Permanent University Fund beyond the main campuses of the University of Texas and Texas A&M.

At his weekly news conference, Gov. Bill Clements said Friday he favors all the schools in the UT and A&M systems sharing in the almost \$2 billion fund generated by oil royalties on state-owned land.

The governor said officials at Texas and Texas A&M have indicated they are willing to include the other schools in their systems

in the sharing of the Permanent University Fund.

"They came to me with their approval for expansion of the PUF," Clements said.

The governor also said he wants the Legislature to create another program to pay for renovation and construction at the other state colleges and universities not under the Texas or Texas A&M systems. He said a minimum of \$60 million should be allocated yearly to the fund.

Clements said he wants the Legislature to act on his recommendations this session. But he said the program for those colleges and universities not under the large systems should be funded by tuition increases or general state revenue. He said the Legislature should decide how to fund the program, and he would make a recommendation on the mechanics of his proposed legislation.

"I'm leaving all those issues flexible and to the discretion of the Legislature, which I think is the way it should be," he said.

The governor also said he would oppose legislation that would reconstitute ad valorem property tax. The Legislature last session voted to effectively do away with the 10-cent-per-\$100 valuation tax by reducing it to an insignificant amount.
