### Newspaper wins suit to receive name list

ODESSA — A district judge, acting at the request of the local
newspaper, has ordered the city to release information about applicants for the vacant police chief's job.
District Judge Joe Connally ruled Friday in favor of the Odessa
American, which had requested information on the applicants from
city manager Kerry Sweatt March 18.

Following the decision, Sweatt said he would release the names and professional qualifications of the 14 applicants Monday. The position, which pays \$33,240 a year, has been vacant since the March 4 resignation for former Chief Jack Tomlin.

Attorney General Mark White had issued three separate opinions saying the newspaper was entitled to the information, but Connally's ruling marked the first time it was backed up by a judge.

Suits were filed by both the city and the newspaper over whether the names should be released.
